Setting the Tone for the Experience

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hi, friends! I'm so excited you're here today! This is the first week of our 'Masterpiece' series. The full name of our series this month is 'Masterpiece—Made by God,' and over the next few weeks, we're going to explore how God made each of us as His very own masterpiece full of purpose!

"Who here loves to create? Maybe you like drawing, painting, crafts, or building things! Raise your hand if that's you.

(Pause while kids raise their hands.)

"Wow, look at all those hands! That's a lot of creatives in one room!

"Let's have some fun to get our creativity flowing. I'm going to say a word, and you have five seconds to act it out or make a pose. You can use your hands, your arms, your face, anything you want! Ready? First word ... painting!

(Kids pose.)

"Great! Next word ... sculpture!

(Kids pose.)

"Next ... music!

(Kids pose.)

"And last one ... drawing!

(Kids pose.)

"Wow! Look at all your amazing ideas! I love it! Now it's time for our first creative challenge: 'Silly Self-Portraits!'

Large Group Game | Silly Self-Portraits

What You Need

No supplies needed

What You Say:

GAME SLIDE 1: Silly Self-Portraits Title

"Here's how the challenge works: Each round, I'll tell you a different way to draw yourself, then you have to draw yourself on the dry-erase board! Sound good?"

"Let's pick four brave artists to come up and try it! Raise your hand if you'd like to play!"

(Pick four kids from the ones who have their hands raised, invite them to the game area, and give each one a dry-erase board and dry-erase marker.)

"Artists, line up and get ready! Awesome!"

"Everybody else, you are the onlookers in the gallery! I need you to practice your best 'Ooooh!' and 'Ahhhh' on the count of three. One ... two ... three!"

(Kids practice.)

"Beautiful. Okay, artists, here comes Round One."

"This round is eyes closed! That means you have to keep your eyes closed the whole time while drawing a picture of yourself. Ready? Three ... two ... one ... GO!"

AUDIO: Upbeat music

Optional Video: Thirty-Second Countdown

(Start thirty-second countdown. Let the kids draw their self-portraits until the thirty-second countdown is up.)

(Once there are five seconds left on the countdown ...)

"Audience, count down with me! Five ... four ... three ... two ... one ... STOP!"

"Artists, you can open your eyes! Hold your boards up high! Audience, let me hear your 'Ooooh!'"

(Pause while audience responds.)

"Let me hear your 'Aaaah!'"

(Pause while audience responds.)

"These are amazing and also hilarious. Great job, everyone! Artists, you can take a seat."

(Continue with more rounds as time allows. Select four new volunteers at the start of each round. Use the whiteboard eraser/paper towels to clean the dry-erase boards in between rounds.)

(Other challenge ideas: draw with your non-dominant hand, draw for only five seconds, draw an upside-down self-portrait.)

"Wow! Every drawing is different. Some were silly, some were very unique, some were upside-down, but we loved seeing them all! And that reminds me of something true about you: God made every person different, and God loves what He made. We're going to dive into that later today. But first, let's check our Bottom Line!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "I am made in the image of God. Can you say that with me?"

KIDS AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "I am made in the image of God."

HOST: "Awesome job, friends! We will be talking more about that very soon!"

What You Say:

AMAZING MUSIC

WORSHIP LEADER: "Hi, friends! I'm so glad you're here today! You know, worship is one of the best things we get to do together. It's a chance to sing, move, and thank God just for being who He is.

"You don't have to sing perfectly. You don't even have to know all the moves. It's more about us coming together and saying, 'I love You, God. You are number one in my life!'

"Our first song is one where we get to use all that energy we have to praise Him! It says, 'Let everything that has breath praise the Lord!' And that means every voice, every jump, every clap—it all brings joy to God. So let's do that now!

SONG: "Let Everything That Has Breath" Dance Motion, Lyric or Instrumental Lyric Videos are available with Amazing Music on APlay

"Awesome! You were singing, moving, and giving God your best. That's the joy of the Lord!

"Now let's slow it down just a little. This next song reminds us of something really special: What God says about us is what matters most. He says you are loved, and His. So as you sing, think about that, and think about how much God loves you. Let's worship together!

"Beautiful! I love hearing your voices and seeing you give all your attention to God.

"Just remember, worship isn't only something we do with music. You can worship God anytime and anywhere! Not just here in [Environment Name].

"I want to tell you something super special. Did you know there's a verse in the Bible that talks about how amazing you are? Not because of what you wear or how fast you can run, but because of how God made you. God made you on purpose, and He made you wonderfully.

"That's what our Memory Verse is all about this month! It's a verse you can remember when you're feeling unsure or when you just want to remember how much God loves you. It's Psalm 139:14!

"Let's see what it says! I'll read it first, then I will guide you through it.

"Now, let me guide you through it. Repeat after me—nice and loud!

What You Say:

BIBLE STORY (STORYTELLER SCRIPT)

SLIDE: Theme Background

(Set up the table at the front of the teaching area so the Storyteller can place their Bible on it and read from it. Container of Play-Doh® and a paper plate on the table.)

Introduction

STORYTELLER: "Hi, friends! I'm so glad you're here today. We're starting a brand-new theme, and it's called 'Masterpiece—Made by God.' This whole month, we're going to talk about how you are a great creation of God! His masterpiece!"

"When I say the word 'masterpiece,' I want you to say, 'Wow!'"

"Ready? Masterpiece!"

KIDS: "Wow!"

HOST: "Nice! Let's try it again—masterpiece!"

KIDS: "Wow!"

HOST: "Great job!"

"A masterpiece is something that is made with extra care. It's not a rushed job. It's not a sloppy job. A masterpiece is something someone is really proud of. Like a really special picture ... or the best tower you've ever built ... or the coolest thing you've ever made."

"Now, I'm going to ask you a question, and you can answer with a thumbs up or thumbs down. Ready?"

"A masterpiece is something you throw together super-fast. What do you think? Thumbs up or thumbs down?"

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Thumbs down, that's right!"

"A masterpiece is something made with care. Thumbs up or thumbs down?"

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Thumbs up! Yes!"

"Now here's the big thing I want you to listen for today: The Bible tells us that God made you like that. God made you with care. God is proud of what He made. You are not an accident. You are not a mistake."

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "In our true story from the Bible today, we're going all the way back to the beginning—before there were houses, or cars, or schools, or playgrounds.

"I want you to imagine a world with nothing you can see. No trees. No animals. No people. Just ... nothing. Can you hold really still like everything is empty? Everybody freeze!

(Pause while kids freeze.)

"Great job, you can unfreeze!

"Then, God began to create. God said words, and things happened! God made light and dark. God made the sky. God made the land and the oceans.

"Show me your biggest 'waves' with your arms, like the ocean!

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Good! Now show me a tall mountain with your arms up high!

(Pause while kids respond.)

"God made plants and trees. God made fish, birds, and animals. And after God made all of it, the Bible tells us it was good. Now here's the moment I want you to really lean in for... because God wasn't done yet.

"After God made the whole world and everything in it, God made something extra special. God made people. God made the very first people! And what God said about people is the most important thing we're learning today because it can teach us about who we are."

God Made People to Be Like Him

STORYTELLER: "I need one volunteer to come up and make a person out of Play-Doh®. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!

(Pick a kid from the ones who have their hands raised, and have them stand behind the table so they can shape the Play-Doh® on the paper plate.)

"While our friend works, let's see what the Bible says.

(Open the Bible and read Genesis 1:26-27 NIV.)

Then God said, "Let us make human beings so that they are like us. Let them rule over the fish in the seas and the birds in the sky. Let them rule

over the livestock and all the wild animals. And let them rule over all the creatures that move along the ground."

So God created human beings in his own likeness.

He created them to be like himself.

He created them as male and female.

"God gave us something amazing inside—His image! It's a beautiful thing.

"God made us to reflect Him. Think about it like a mirror. A mirror shows what is in front of it. God made people to be like a mirror, showing what He is like in the world. That means we can show kindness, love, and goodness to other people. We can help others, we can tell the truth, and we can forgive.

(Have the volunteer hold up the Play-Doh® person.)

"Look at the person our helper made. Just like this Play-Doh® person was shaped carefully, God shaped each of us carefully. God made every person to reflect Him in a special way. That's why the Bible says making people was the most important part of creation—God made people to be like Him, and that never changes.

"Now, if that's where the story ended, God making people in His image, it would be a perfect world. But as you know, the world is not perfect. The first people God made, Adam and Eve, chose to go their own way instead of God's way. They sinned. That sinful choice made it so they couldn't be close to God anymore. Sin also infected the hearts of every single person who was born after Adam and Eve. Sin made things messy.

"When we choose to sin, when we choose to do things that go against God, we don't reflect Him very well. Although people are made in the image of God, we don't always reflect Him well."

Jesus Shows Us Exactly What God Is Like

STORYTELLER: "God didn't want us to wonder what it looks like to show His image perfectly. So He did something huge so we would know what He is like!

"I need a helper to come up and make a cross out of Play-Doh®. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!

(Pick a kid from the ones who have their hands raised, and have them stand behind the table so they can shape the Play-Doh® on the paper plate.)

"Don't worry about making it perfect—just shape a simple cross. Go ahead!

"While our friend is working, let's read what the Bible says.

(Open your Bible and read Colossians 1:15 NIV.)

The Son is the exact likeness of God, who can't be seen. The Son is first, and he is over all creation.

"Since we don't reflect God perfectly, God sent Jesus so we could see what God is like! As this verse tells us: Jesus is the perfect picture of God. Because He is God! That means when we see what Jesus does, we see exactly what God is like. When Jesus showed love, that was God's love. When Jesus helped people who were hurting, that was God helping. When Jesus forgave people who made mistakes, that was God forgiving.

"And here's something very important: Remember how those first people chose to go their own way and sinned? How they fell under the curse of sin and everyone after them did too? How they couldn't be close to God anymore and neither could anyone else? Well, Jesus gave His life to pay for sin. He broke the curse of sin and death. And because He paid for sin, He made a way for us to be close to God again! Now we can spend our lives being Jesus' friends, getting to know Him, and becoming more and more like Him.

(Have the volunteer hold up the Play-Doh® cross.)

"Hold it up high! This cross reminds us of what Jesus did for us. When we choose to accept that Jesus paid for our sins on the cross, Jesus' very Spirit, the Holy Spirit, moves inside of us. He can help us reflect God better because He is God! We can show kindness, love, forgiveness, and truth to others, just like Jesus did."

God Made You Amazing and Wonderful

STORYTELLER: "God wants every one of you to know something very important about yourselves.

"Now, I need a helper to come up and make a heart with Play-Doh®. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!

(Pick a kid from the ones who have their hands raised, and have them stand behind the table so they can shape the Play-Doh® on the paper plate.)

"You can make it big, small, or however you like—just make a heart!

"While our friend is shaping the heart, let's read what the Bible says about you.

(Open the Bible and read Psalm 139:14 NIV.)

How you made me is amazing and wonderful.

I praise you for that.

What you have done is wonderful.

I know that very well.

"This verse reminds us that God made each of us with care. God didn't rush when He made you. He didn't make any mistakes. He thought about every part of you—your hands, your smile, your laugh, and even your heart. Everything about you is part of God's wonderful design.

"Even though this world is broken and we don't always reflect God perfectly, being made in His image is still who we are. God's love and design for you never change. And as we follow Jesus, we can grow to show more of God's love, kindness, and goodness in everything we do.

(Have the volunteer hold up their Play-Doh® heart.)

"Look at this heart! It reminds us that God loves us and we can reflect His love. He made you amazing and wonderful."

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Today, we learned some really important truths about God and ourselves. First, God made people to reflect Him. Being made in God's image is so special.

"Then we learned that Jesus shows us exactly what God is like. He is the perfect picture of God. Because of what Jesus did on the cross, taking the punishment for our sin, we can be forgiven and have a relationship with God, and His image can now be clearer in our lives.

"God made each of us amazing and wonderful. Even though sin sometimes makes it harder to reflect God perfectly, God's love and design for us never change. He made us with care, and He is proud of what He made.

"Our Bottom Line today talks about this too. Let's see what it says.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "I am made in the image of God. Can you say that with me?"

(Host enters and joins in.)

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "I am made in the image of God."

What You Say:

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "Being made in God's image is two things: It's a status we all have. And it's something we are all to do as Jesus followers.

"So, as a starting point: Remember that you are made in God's image, no matter who you are or what you've done. That is something we are born with—it doesn't depend on our grades, how popular you are, or what other people think. You are made in God's image just because He made you, and nothing can take it away.

"Then, live that status out. God doesn't just want us to know we are made in His image, He wants us to live it. That means we get to show kindness, love, truth, and forgiveness to the people around us. We can share God's love with friends, family, and even people we don't know very well. Every time we are loving, honest, or helpful, we are showing what God is like.

"And the best part? We don't have to do it alone. God sent Jesus to show us exactly how to live. And the Holy Spirit inside of us helps us grow to be more like Jesus every day. So remember who you are, ask the Holy Spirit to help you, and then do the next right thing—being kind, truthful, loving, and honest, like Jesus would—so others can see God through you.

"Let's talk to the God who loves us so much, He made us in His image!"

- Download music and/or sound effects on an authorized basis from a resource such as Apple Music®, Amazon Music®, and/or a sound effect library and have it ready to play. Or, if you choose to stream music, refer to the terms and conditions of your streaming service. Note that you will likely need a commercial license in order to stream music publicly. Also confirm that your church has appropriate licensing to perform music and sound effects in your kids' environments, such as a blanket PERFORMmusic™ license from CCS. *Note: Legally, a song and/or sound effect belongs to the songwriter/composer who created it and the publisher who markets it. Performance rights organizations (PROs) license public performances (live or recorded) of their members' music. PROs in the U.S. are ASCAP, BMI, and SESAC. It is up to you to make sure your church has permission to perform or play a recording of a song and/or sound effect.*
- *Optional:* Download a countdown video from a royalty-free site. Load it into your presentation software and have it ready to play during the Opener. You could also keep time on a smartphone or watch. *Note: Some presentation software, such as ProPresenter, includes a built-in countdown clock that can be overlaid on a still image.*
- Set up the table in the game area. Place four dry-erase boards, four dry-erase markers, and whiteboard eraser/paper towels on the table for the game.

Pay attention to the details, because when the music stops, I'm going to give you a special challenge!"

BIBLE STORY (STORYTELLER SCRIPT)

SLIDE: Theme Background

(Things to have ready: Set up the table at the front of the teaching area so the Storyteller can place their Bible on it and read from it. Toolbox with tools inside hidden underneath the table.)

Introduction

STORYTELLER: "Hi, friends! Welcome back to 'Masterpiece!' Our theme this month is: 'Masterpiece—Made by God' and all month long, we're talking about how you are one of God's greatest creations! You were made on purpose for a purpose!

"As we dive into our true story from the Bible today, I need your best listening ears and your biggest imaginations.

"I want us to pretend for a moment. Close your eyes ... and picture this: you're walking into a big workshop. Maybe it smells like wood and paint. Maybe you hear little tap tap tap sounds like someone is working. And right in the middle of the room is a big, shiny toolbox.

"Imagine it sitting right in front of you. The lid is closed ... but inside, maybe there's a hammer ... maybe there's a paintbrush ... maybe there's a ruler ... maybe there's a pencil. Lots of tools. Lots of possibilities.

(Bring out the toolbox, and set it on the table.)

"Okay, keep your eyes closed one more second ... I want you to imagine the lid creaking open, like this ... creaaaaak. And you peek inside.

"Now, open your eyes! Ta-da! I actually have a real toolbox right here. In just a minute, we're going to open it and see what's inside. Because God is building something beautiful! And we get to help!"

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "I want to ask you a question that grown-ups ask kids a lot. They say ... 'What do you want to be when you grow up?'

"Some of you might already have an answer. You might say, 'A teacher!' or 'A doctor!' or 'A firefighter!' or 'An artist!' or maybe even, 'I want to fly to space!' And some of you might say, 'Ummm ... I don't know.' And you know what? That is totally okay.

"Because today's Bible Story tells us something really cool. Even if you don't know what you want to be someday, God already knows you. God already loves you. And God already has good things prepared for you, both now and when you're bigger. And His purpose for us is bigger

than jobs and bigger than when we grow up. His purpose can happen however old we are!

"Alright ... listening ears on ... let's see what God's Word says."

God Made Me for a Purpose

STORYTELLER:

(Open the Bible and read Ephesians 2:10 NIV.)

We are God's creation. He created us to belong to Christ Jesus. Now we can do good works. Long ago God prepared these works for us to do.

"Did you hear that? The Bible says we are God's creation. That means God made you. On purpose. Not by accident. And He made you to belong to Jesus. That means you have a place with Him. You fit, and you are loved.

"And it also says God prepared good works for us to do. Now, when the Bible says, 'good works,' it's talking about the kinds of things that help people know God and see God's love.

"Good works can look like praying for people when they need help. Good works can look like serving, helping, and caring for others because Jesus loves them. And good works can look like sharing about Jesus, telling someone, 'Jesus loves you,' or 'God is with you,' or 'Jesus is my Savior, and He can be your Savior too.' When we do good works, we're joining God in what He's doing.

"Now let's open our toolbox, because this is going to help us remember something important.

(Open the toolbox, and hold up different tools.)

"Whoa, look! A hammer, a screwdriver, a paintbrush! Here's a ruler and a pencil. They're all different, but each one has a purpose. Now, a quick question, could I build a whole house with only this hammer?

"No way! A hammer would help with it, but not do all of it. What if I tried to paint a wall with this ruler? That would look like a very interesting wall ...

"That would be pretty silly, right? Each one is designed on purpose and helps our everyday life. Each tool has a job it's made to do.

"In the same way, God has given each one of us the same big purpose: to show the love of Jesus to other people. But God made each of us different, so the way you show that love won't always look the same as the person next to you. You might be a hammer, or a ruler, but whatever tool you are, God is building something beautiful! He is building His kingdom and showing His love.

"As we'll see today, your life is part of shaping you into whatever you are going to be. God has prepared work for the hammer, the paintbrush, whatever tool you are. And we are all to contribute to the beautiful work God is doing of showing His great love, no matter where we are and no matter how we do it!"

Timothy's Prepared Life

STORYTELLER: "Now, let's see how this happened in someone's life. Let's meet someone from the Bible named Timothy. Can you say, 'Timothy'?"

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Great! Timothy was one of Paul's best friends. Timothy lived in the town of Lystra—and his family was different from everyone else's. Timothy's mom was Jewish, but his father was Greek. It probably wasn't easy for Timothy—trying to live in both worlds.

"After Paul visited Lystra, Timothy became a believer in Jesus! Remember how we talked about 'good works'? Timothy started doing those. Timothy didn't just learn about God, he lived it out. He served the church. He cared about people and helped them follow Jesus too. In his own 'Timothy' way, with the life God had given him, he did good works.

"Later, when Paul returned, many of the believers had good things to say about Timothy. Though Timothy was young, he was already doing lots of things that showed he was following Jesus. Paul needed someone to help him tell people about Jesus. And he could see that not only did Timothy love Jesus, but that because of his family, Timothy would be comfortable talking with people who were from all different backgrounds.

"All of this made Timothy a perfect fit to travel with Paul! God hadn't wasted a thing in Timothy's life. Later, Paul even left Timothy in charge of the church in Ephesus. Paul wanted Timothy to know something important: Being young didn't stop God from using him. Paul wrote to him—

(Open the Bible and read 1 Timothy 4:12 NIV.)

Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young. Set an example for the believers in what you say and in how you live. Also set an example in how you love and in what you believe. Show the believers how to be pure.

"That means Timothy didn't have to wait until he was older to do God's work. God used him while he was still young! And God can use you while you're still young too. God used Timothy when he was in Lystra doing good works, and God used Timothy in Ephesus when he was doing good works. God used Timothy all the time. And God can use you to do good works at any point too!"

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "God's Word says that we are God's creation. God made you on purpose, and He made you to belong to Jesus. And God has already prepared good works for us to do.

"Things like praying for others, serving, sharing, saying kind words, and sharing about Jesus so people can know Him too.

"Timothy was young, but he didn't wait. God used Timothy while he was still young to help Paul, to serve the church, and to share the good news about Jesus. And Paul even reminded Timothy that being young didn't stop him from being part of what God was doing.

"Today's Bottom Line talks about this too. Let's check it out.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "God made me for a purpose. Can you say that with me?"

(Host enters and joins in.)

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "God made me for a purpose."

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST "Before you do anything at all, know this: God made you and God loves you. The Bible tells us that you are God's creation, and you belong to Jesus.

"Then because you belong to Jesus, God has good works for you to do. That means God has things prepared for you, ways you can show people what God is like. God has given each one of us the same big purpose: to show the love of Jesus to other people. But God made each of us different, so the way you show that love won't always look the same as the person next to you. You are a hammer, or a paintbrush, but whatever tool you are, you are part of the beautiful work of showing the world how good God is!

"And you can show God's heart in your own way. Maybe you're really good at drawing, so you could show God's love by drawing a card! Maybe God gave you a strong body, so you can help carry in the groceries and spread God's love by being helpful! Maybe you are really funny, so you can spread God's joy by making people laugh and smile. You were made to share God's love in your own way!

"And God uses every single detail in your life to shape you—just like He used Timothy's family background to help prepare him to share God's love with lots of people. God can use it all to help you show His love.

"So this week, remember: You don't have to wait until you're older to be part of what God is doing. God wants to use you right where you are, right now, to do the good works He has prepared for you. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you the good works God has prepared for you right now. They might be small, but God can use them in big ways. And you can also ask your parents or a grown-up you trust to tell you what they see in how God made you, because sometimes they can spot the ways you're really good at showing God's love even when you don't notice them yet."

"Let's talk to the God who is building something beautiful!"

What You Need

What You Say:

GAME SLIDE 1: Finish the Picture Title

"I'm going to need two teams, and each team will have four players. I need eight volunteers! Raise your hand if you're ready to play!"

(Choose eight kids from the ones who have their hands raised, and line them up at the start line in two teams of four.)

"Here's how it works: When I say, 'Go,' the first person on each team will run to the picture taped to the wall, find one numbered shape, grab the color marker that matches that number, and color in that section. When you finish one section, run back and tag the next teammate. Then they go. Remember, only one section at a time! The first team to finish their whole picture wins! We also have our numbers and colors on the screen so you know which color goes with which number.

"Everyone else, your job is to cheer! Everyone ready?"

"Ready ... set ... FINISH THE PICTURE!"

GAME SLIDE 2: Finish the Picture (color key)

AUDIO: Upbeat music

"Look at those colors! Keep going! You've got this!"

"Today, we're focusing on a verse that tells us something powerful about who we are because of God. This isn't just a nice sentence; this is what God says about you in the Bible. That means it's true!

What You Say:

INTRODUCTION

STORYTELLER: "Hi, friends! Welcome back to our third week in our series: 'Masterpiece—Made by God.' All month long, we've been learning about how we are God's greatest creation, His masterpiece!

"As we look at a super-important truth from the Bible today, let's start with something fun. I want you to listen to what I say and show me your best face for how you'd feel. If it's something good, give me your biggest, brightest smile. If it's something yucky or not-so-fun, scrunch up your face and show me your best 'yucky' look.

"Okay, let's try! Imagine you find a dollar on the ground, show me your face! Wow, look at all those big smiles! I'd be excited too.

"Now, what if you got caught in the rain without your coat? Oooh, I see those faces! That does sound soggy and chilly.

"Picture someone sharing their snack with you at lunch. Oh, that's the best! I love seeing those happy faces.

"What if you forgot your homework at home? Uh-oh! That would feel a little yucky, right?

"And what if you had to eat something you don't like? I can see some yucky faces out there!

"You know, you all have the best faces! Some days are super happy, and some days are just kind of yucky. But here's what's amazing: the Bible tells us God can use every part of our lives, the fun and the hard, for something good. Even when things don't go our way, God is working for good. He is a good, good God!

"Today, we're going to hear about people in the Bible who had both good and hard days, and how God turned it all into something amazing."

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "I want you to think about a time something happened that just didn't make sense, or maybe felt really hard. Maybe you had a bad day, or things didn't turn out the way you wanted. Did you know that in the Bible, there are lots of stories where people felt that way too? They had days that were amazing and days that were tough. Sometimes, they couldn't see what God was doing at first, but God was always at work.

"Today's Bible Story will show us how God can take all the parts of our lives, both the good and the hard, and work them together for something good."

God Can Use All Things

STORYTELLER: "Sometimes life feels a little bit sour!

(Hold up the whole lemon.)

"Just like this lemon! Who thinks lemons are super sour? Let's all make our best sour face together!

(Pause while kids make sour faces.)

"Oh yeah, super sour faces! I need a brave helper to come join me and help with the story today. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!

(Choose one kid from the ones who have their hands raised, and invite them to join you at the front of the teaching area.)

"Let's all say hi to our helper! They're going to help with every step.

(Hand the volunteer a slice of lemon.)

"Okay, friend, would you dare to take a tiny bite of this slice of lemon? Do you guys think our helper will do it?

(Pause while audience responds.)

"Okay, our helper is going to try! On three ... one, two, three!

(Pause while helper takes a bite of the lemon slice. Return their bitten piece back to the plate.)

"Oh wow! That is a super sour face! Lemons are so sour by themselves. We don't eat a lemon like we would an orange, do we? Sometimes, life feels just like that. Maybe something happens that you wish were different or a day feels tough or confusing. It's not always sweet.

"Let's pour some lemon juice into this pitcher.

(Helper pours the one liquid measuring cup of lemon juice into the empty pitcher.)

"Now let's pour some water into the pitcher.

(Helper pours in the 6 cups of water from the second pitcher to the pitcher with lemon juice in it.)

"Now we have lemon water. Who thinks it will taste sweet right now?

(Pour some in a cup for the helper to try.)

"Okay, let's try this again. Helper, maybe this is going to taste better, right?

(Helper takes a sip.)

"Still a little sour, right? Definitely not sweet. Sometimes life feels like that—unfinished or not what we hoped.

"Well, the Bible can actually help us understand this more.

(Open your Bible and read Romans 8:28 NIV.)

We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him. He appointed them to be saved in keeping with his purpose.

"Let's talk about what this means! This is a really, really important truth about life. This verse tells us that God is always at work, even when things feel hard, or sad, or not what we wanted. God doesn't just use the happy, easy days. He can take every part of our lives—even the tough or sour parts—and use them for good.

"That doesn't mean everything will feel good right away. Sometimes we go through things that are hard. But God promises He will never waste anything. He takes every part of our story and uses it for good, because He loves us so much. This does not mean that God *causes* hard things to happen—but it does mean that God is so good and powerful that He can work good through every single thing in our lives.

"That's just like this lemonade! Right now, it's still sour. But God isn't finished in your story."

God Used Moses' Story for Good

STORYTELLER: "Our lemonade is still pretty sour! But let's see what happens when we add something sweet. Who thinks adding sugar will help our lemonade taste better? Let's all say, 'Add the sugar!'"

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Great! Helper, can you help me add some sugar to our lemon water? Go ahead and pour it in! And then you can stir it up."

(Helper pours the cup of sugar into the pitcher and stirs it.)

"Give it a good stir. Now, let's leave it to mix while we hear about someone in the Bible who had some really tough things happen, but God worked it for good!

"A long time ago, there was a man named Moses. Moses' life had lots of tough and scary parts. When Moses was a baby in Egypt, his family had to hide him so he would be safe. Moses grew up in the Egyptian palace, but he made a bad choice and ran away from home. For many years, for forty long years, he was a shepherd, watching sheep.

"But God wasn't finished with Moses' story! God used all those things, the hard parts and the times when Moses was learning and growing, to get him ready.

"When Moses was an old man, when he was tending sheep, God called him to do something amazing: to lead God's people out of Egypt and into freedom! God gave Moses courage, and He used everything that had happened in Moses' life to help others.

"Remember, our Bible verse, our truth from the Bible said, *'In all things God works for the good of those who love him'* (Romans 8:28 NIV). That means God used Moses' life, even the tough parts, to do something good. God can do that in your life too."

God Used Paul's Story for Good

STORYTELLER: "Let's hear one more story from the Bible that shows how God works all things for good. There was a man named Paul. Paul had some really, really hard days while he was traveling around telling people about Jesus. At different points on his journey, Paul was put in jail, he was hungry, he was shipwrecked, and he even got hurt. But Paul loved Jesus and kept trusting God, even when things were really tough.

"God used those hard things in Paul's life for good! While Paul was in jail, he wrote letters that we can still read in the Bible today. And even though he had hard days, God helped Paul tell more and more people about Jesus. God used every part of Paul's story to help others know about His love.

"And guess what? Paul is actually the one who wrote Romans 8:28! He wrote it in one of his letters. Paul knew God works for the good of those who love him. Paul had experienced that in his life!

"Our lemonade started out sour, but we added sugar and stirred it up. Now let's have our helper try it one more time.

(Storyteller stirs it once more and pours a cup for the helper and for themselves.)

"Wow! This is some pretty good lemonade. We really did take lemons and made them into lemonade. All the sour and sweet mixed together and turned into something good.

"That's just like how God works in our lives. He can use the good days and the hard days. He mixes it all together and brings out something wonderful, just like our lemonade. When you go through something tough, remember: God can use all things for good, just like He did for Moses and Paul! God is so, so good, and He loves you so much, that He is always working everything for good.

"Helper, you did so great today helping me make lemonade! And tasting the not-so-tasty parts! Let's give them a round of applause! You can take a seat!"

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Today, we learned that God can use all things. We saw how Moses had hard days, but God used every part of his story for good.

Paul went through tough times too, and God helped him tell people about Jesus, even when it was really hard.

"Remember our lemonade? It started out super sour, but we added sugar and kept stirring. In the end, it turned into something sweet and good. That's just like how God works in our lives. He takes the happy times and the tough times and uses them to make something good and beautiful.

"So the next time something happens that feels sour or hard, remember, God isn't finished with your story! He can use all things for good, because He loves you and He is so, so good!

"That reminds me of our Bottom Line!

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "God Can Use All Things."

(Host enters and joins in.)

"Say it with me!

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: [Bottom Line] "God can use all things."

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "What does this all mean for you and me? Sometimes you might have a great day—maybe you win a game, make a new friend, or have a lot of fun. Those are sweet days! Other times, you might have a day that feels kind of sour. Maybe you get in trouble, someone hurts your feelings, or things just don't go the way you want. Those are the tough days.

"But remember what we learned with our lemonade? It started out so sour, but we added something sweet, and mixed it together. In the same way, when we trust God with every part of our lives—both the happy parts and the hard parts—He can make something good. He promises that He is working for good! You can talk to God about anything. When something feels tough, you can pray, 'God, please help me trust that You are working for good, even when it's hard.' You can ask Him to help you be brave and trust Him. He wants to help you!

"God may use the hard parts to help you learn, or to help someone else, or to show His love in a big way. Even when you don't understand right away, you can believe that God is always working for good and He loves you so much.

"This week, if something feels sour, remember that God is with you, and He is making something good, even if you can't see it yet.

"Let's talk to the God who is always working toward something good, because He loves us so much!"

Setting the Tone for the Experience

What You Say:

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, friends! I'm so glad you're here today. You all look ready for something fun, so let's start with a quick challenge. Turn to someone next to you, and give them your biggest, brightest smile.

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Awesome! Now, show them your silliest wave.

(Pause while kids respond.)

"I love it! This room is full of masterpieces!

"We're in a series called 'Masterpiece—Made by God.' That means you're special, and God made you on purpose. But here's the cool part: God made every person in this room special too. And today, we're going to see how much Jesus values every single person.

"But first, it's time to play a game called ... 'Frame It!'

Large Group Game | Frame It!

What You Need

What You Say:

GAME SLIDE 1: Frame It! Title

"I need four volunteers to come up and grab a frame. Raise your hand if you'd like to volunteer!"

(Pick four kids from the ones who have their hands raised, invite them to the game area, and have each one pick up a frame.)

"Here's how it works: I'm going to call out something you can find in the room—maybe a color, a shape, or something God made. Be prepared for whatever! When I give you the challenge, run and find that thing, then put your frame around it to show everyone!"

"Everyone else, your job is to cheer them on and spot good answers. Sound good?"

"Okay, let's start with something easy."

"Artists, are you ready? Audience, are you ready to cheer them on? Let's go!"

AUDIO: Upbeat music

"I love it! Look at them go! Artists, hold up your framed object for everyone to see!"

(Continue with more rounds as time allows. Ask for four new volunteers at the start of each round. Other ideas for the kids to frame: something square, something God made, something cool, something that has electricity, a leader.)

"You all did a fantastic job. This room is full of so many interesting things and amazing people. That's a perfect reminder for today, because our Bible Story is about how Jesus sees and values everyone."

"Our Bottom Line today talks about that too! Let's go ahead and learn it."

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Jesus values everyone. Can you say that with me?"

KIDS AND HOST: *[Bottom Line]* "Jesus values everyone."

WORSHIP LEADER: "Hello, friends! I'm so excited to be with you today! This is the part of our service where we get to sing together and talk to God. Worship isn't just about music—it's about letting God know how much we love Him and want to follow Him.

"We have two songs today. Our first song is 'Friend of God.' This song reminds us that God wants to be close to us, not just far away. God cares about you and wants to call you His friend! As we sing, think about how amazing it is that the God who made the whole universe wants to be your friend!

BIBLE STORY (STORYTELLER SCRIPT)

SLIDE: Theme Background

(Things to have ready: Set up the table at the front of the teaching area so the Storyteller can place their Bible on it and read from it.)

Introduction

STORYTELLER: "Hi, everyone! I'm so happy you're here today. I'm so excited that you're here for the fourth week of our series: 'Masterpiece—Made by God.' All month long, we've been looking at how we are God's greatest creation!

"Today, we're looking at something that happened in Jesus' life that can teach us all more about who we are. As we get started, I want you to look around this room. There are so many different people here! Some of us have different hair colors, some of us are tall, some of us are short, some of us are wearing bright colors, and some of us are wearing cool shoes. Can you spot someone who is wearing something you like? Point to them and say, 'Hey! I like what you are wearing!'

"You all are so nice! Now, I want you to think for a second: Have you ever felt left out or ignored? Maybe you were new somewhere? Or maybe your friends decided just not to be friends with you anymore? Can you give me a small thumbs up if you know what that feels like? Wow, a lot of us know that feeling! That's not a good feeling, is it?

"Today's story is about a woman who was left out—a lot. But Jesus noticed her, talked to her, and showed her that she was important and loved, no matter what.

"Are you ready to hear about a time when Jesus made someone feel special? Let's listen and see how Jesus wants us to treat others too."

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Okay, friends, let's travel back in time together. Imagine the hot sun shining down, the ground is dusty, and Jesus is walking with His friends, disciples. They had been walking for a long time, and they were tired and thirsty. Can you pretend to wipe your forehead like you're hot and thirsty, too?

"Now, Jesus and His friends came to a place called Samaria. This place was important because most Jewish people didn't like to stop there. In fact, they usually went the long way around to avoid it!

"But Jesus did something different—He walked right into Samaria. The disciples went into town. But Jesus decided to sit down by a well, a big stone place where people came to get water, and He waited."

Jesus Sees Everyone

STORYTELLER: "Before we go even further, I need your help to make this story come alive! Here's how: Whenever I talk about someone being kind, I want you to cheer as loud as you can. But if I mention someone being left out, ignored, or treated badly, I want you to give your biggest 'boo.' Let's practice: If someone shares their snack with you, what do you do?"

(Pause while kids react.)

"If someone says, 'You can't play with us!' what do you do?"

(Pause while kids react.)

"Yes! Keep those reactions ready because you're going to need them.

"So, let's go back to our story. Jesus was sitting down by a big stone well while His friends went to find some food.

"Then, a woman came to the well all by herself. Back then, people who had friends usually came together in the cool morning, but she was alone at the hottest part of the day. That means other people probably didn't want to be around her. Do you think that's very nice?"

(Pause while kids react.)

"But Jesus saw her, right there by herself. He didn't look away or ignore her. He started talking to her. He made her feel important. If you think it's awesome to notice someone and make them feel welcome, what do you do?"

(Pause while kids react.)

"Now, this was surprising! Most people thought Jesus wouldn't talk to her because she was an outcast. And men and women rarely talked to each other in public. But Jesus didn't care what others thought, He cared about the woman. He looked right at her and asked her something simple.

(Open the Bible and read John 4:7 NIV.)

*A woman from Samaria came to get some water. Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?"

"Jesus spoke kindly and respectfully to her. He showed her that she mattered. That's the kind of love Jesus has for everyone. He values each person, even if others don't."

Jesus Values Everyone, No Matter What

STORYTELLER: "Let's keep those cheers and boos ready! Sometimes people think that if someone has made bad choices, they don't deserve

a friend. If someone is left out or picked on for their bad choices, is that good?

(Pause while kids react.)

"But Jesus wasn't like that. He knew everything about the woman at the well—even the things she was embarrassed about. He could have said, 'I can't talk to you, you're too different.' But Jesus didn't ignore her or pretend she hadn't made bad choices. He spoke the truth with kindness.

(Open the Bible and read John 4:16-18 NIV.)

He told her, "Go. Get your husband and come back."

"I have no husband," she replied.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands. And the man you live with now is not your husband. What you have just said is very true."

"Jesus knew all about her, but He still loved and valued her. If you think that's amazing, let's hear those cheers!

(Pause while kids react.)

"Jesus valued her and invited her into something better. He wanted her to leave behind the wrong choices and step into a new life with Him. Jesus loves everyone so much, but He also calls us to change, to grow, and to follow Him."

Jesus' Love Changes Everything

STORYTELLER: "Time to keep our cheers and boos going! The woman at the well could hardly believe how Jesus treated her. He didn't ignore her or talk down to her, even though Jesus knew everything she did. Jesus valued her and told her the truth about who He was. Jesus said something very special to her."

(Open the Bible and read John 4:25-26 NIV.)

The woman said, "I know that Messiah is coming." Messiah means Christ. "When he comes, he will explain everything to us."

Then Jesus said, "The one you're talking about is the one speaking to you. I am he."

"Can you imagine how she felt? No one else wanted to talk to her, but Jesus spoke with her and told her who He really was! He told her that He is the Savior! If you think that's amazing, let's hear those cheers!

(Pause while kids react.)

"But it gets even better. The woman was so excited, she ran back to her town and told everyone the good news.

(Open the Bible and read John 4:28-29 NIV.)

The woman left her water jar and went back to the town. She said to the people, "Come. See a man who told me everything I've ever done. Could this be the Messiah?"

"And guess what? All the people came out to meet Jesus. Many believed in Him because of what the woman said, and then even more believed because they heard Jesus themselves. If someone shares something good and helps others know about Jesus, let's cheer!

(Pause while kids react.)

"If someone keeps good news all to themselves, maybe we'd give a little boo.

(Pause while kids react.)

[Bottom Line] "Jesus values everyone, and if we follow Jesus, then we should too."

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "In today's story, Jesus did something unexpected. He talked with someone others ignored. But He listened to her, spoke kindly, and helped her know she was valuable. Even though others may have walked past her, Jesus stopped and showed her what it means to be really valued.

[Bottom Line] "Jesus values everyone. That's true for the woman at the well, and it's true for you, for me, and for the people around you. When you wonder if you matter, remember: Jesus sees you. When you wonder if someone else matters, remember: Jesus values them too.

"Let's take a look at our Bottom Line for today.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "Jesus Values Everyone."

(Host enters and joins in.)

"Say that with me!"

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "Jesus values everyone."

What You Say:

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "Jesus showed the woman at the well that she was valuable, no matter what others thought. And that's true for you too! No matter who you are, where you live, or what you've done, you are made in the image of God. God has a purpose for you and loves you so much that He sent Jesus to rescue you.

"The same thing is true of every single person that you will ever come across—your family, friends, the people at school, the people in your neighborhood, the people at the grocery store, the bus driver, everyone.

"Our job is to be like Jesus and value others too. That means looking for people who might feel left out or lonely. It means listening when someone needs a friend. It means showing kindness, even when it's hard. No one is beyond God's reach, and He wants them all to come to know Him. When we share the love of Jesus, it can help them change and better reflect who God is.

"So this week, start seeing people the way Jesus does—with love and kindness. When you see someone who's alone, remember how Jesus went out of His way for the woman at the well. Ask Him to help you show His love! He can help you show His love to everyone, everywhere.

"Let's talk to the God who values everyone!"

OPENER

HOST: "Hey, everyone! Welcome to [Your Environment Name]! I'm so glad you're here today. If this is your first time, we're so excited you joined us!"

"Our series this month is called 'Masterpiece—Made by God,' and all month long, we've been talking about how you are a masterpiece, made by God on purpose and for a purpose. And today, we get to discover how the gifts God put in us can grow and help God build something amazing—His kingdom!"

"Let's get started by saying 'hi' to each other! Look around the room, find three people you didn't come here with, and give them a big wave or a high five!"

(Pause while kids interact with each other.)

"Awesome! Now, if you're wearing the color green, stand up and show us your strongest superhero pose! Go on, strike a pose!"

(Pause while kids stand up.)

"Wow, I see some green superheroes in the room!"

"Okay, now if your favorite snack is something sweet, do a little happy dance! But if you'd rather have something salty, spin around five times!"

(Pause while kids do the actions.)

"Wow! That was fun! You guys can take a seat."

"Raise your hand if you love to draw, build, or create things."

(Pause while kids respond.)

What You Say:

INTRODUCTION

STORYTELLER: "Hi, friends! I'm so glad you're here today. This week is the last week in our series: 'Masterpiece—Made by God.' All month long, we've been looking at how we are God's greatest creation. We are a masterpiece! God's masterpiece!

"You know what I've been thinking about? How amazing it is that God made every single one of us, and that we all have different things we love to do and are good at!

"Let's see some of those things. Raise your hand if you like to paint or color.

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Awesome! Now, raise your hand if you're really good at building with blocks or LEGOs®.

(Pause while kids respond.)

"I bet there have been some insane LEGO® masterpieces from you all.

"Anyone in here love to dance? What about sing? Does anyone like to help others or make people laugh?

(Pause while kids respond.)

"Wow, I love to see this! The list could go on and on of things you all like to do.

"See, God gave each one of us unique gifts. And when we use those gifts, especially together, we can do something even bigger than we imagined.

"In today's Bible Story, we're going to learn about a big job God gave to His people and how He gave them exactly what they needed to do it. He gave them skills, abilities, and even the materials—everything they needed! We're going all the way back to the book of Exodus to find out what happened. Are you ready?"

Setting up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Okay, let's rewind way, way back to a time when God's people had just been rescued from Egypt. God had done some incredible things to free them, and now they were traveling through the wilderness.

"Even though they were free, they didn't have a place to live yet. They were living in tents and moving from place to place. But God had a very special plan. God wanted His people to know He was close!

"He told a man named Moses to build something amazing. It was a huge tent, but it wasn't just any tent. It was a big, beautiful tent called the tabernacle—a place where the people could worship God and remember that He was always with them.

"But guess what? Moses couldn't build it all by himself. He wasn't a builder or an artist. And he didn't have the materials that were needed. He needed help. And that's where today's story gets really cool ... because God had already picked out people with special gifts to help build it! And He had already given the people all the materials they'd need. God really had taken care of everything!"

God Gives Building Gifts

STORYTELLER: "When Moses was up on Mount Sinai, God told Moses what to build. He said:

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 25:8-9 NIV.)

"Have them make a sacred tent for me. I will live among them. Make the holy tent and everything that belongs to it. Make them exactly like the pattern I will show you."

"This wasn't just any tent! It was going to be beautiful because it was patterned after something in heaven. God told Moses to make it out of gold, colorful fabric, carved wood, and detailed embroidery. But Moses couldn't build it all by himself. So God gave the people exactly what they needed. First, He started by giving someone a very special gift.

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 31:1-5 NIV.)

Then the Lord spoke to Moses. He said, "I have chosen Bezalel, the son of Uri. Uri is the son of Hur. Bezalel is from the tribe of Judah. I have filled him with the Spirit of God. I have filled Bezalel with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge and with all kinds of skill. He can make beautiful patterns in gold, silver and bronze. He can cut and set stones. He can work with wood. In fact, he can work in all kinds of crafts."

"God gave an amazing gift to a man named Bezalel.

(Hold up one of the small gift bags, and place it on the table. Pull out the pad of sticky notes. Place a few of that color sticky note on the posterboard in the lines of the heart. Leave plenty of room for the other colors.)

"Because of God, Bezalel was super-creative—he was an artist, a builder, and a designer. God filled him with the Holy Spirit and gave him wisdom, skill, and creativity. And the skills God gave him helped him build something beautiful.

"What gifts has God given you? Think about that as you listen.

"Let's keep going and see what happens next in the story. It wasn't just Bezalel—there were lots of people God was going to give gifts to!

"God told Moses this:

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 31:6a NIV.)

"I have also appointed Oholiab, the son of Ahisamak, to help [Bezalel]. Oholiab is from the tribe of Dan.

(Hold up another small gift bag, and place it on the table. Pull out the pad of sticky notes. Place a few of that color sticky note on the posterboard in the lines of the heart. Leave plenty of room for the other colors.)

"God also gifted Oholiab to help with this special build.

"Let's see what else God said:

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 31:6b NIV.)

"I have given ability to all the skilled workers. They can make everything I have commanded you to make."

(Hold up two more small gift bags, and place them on the table. Pull out the two pads of different colored sticky notes. Place a few of both colors of sticky notes on the posterboard in the lines of the heart. Leave plenty of room for the other colors.)

"God knew lots of people would need the skills to build. So he gave lots of workers building skills!"

God Gives More Gifts

STORYTELLER: "The Bible tells us that God did something even more amazing. He gave Bezalel and Oholiab the ability to teach others!

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 35:34a NIV.)

And the Lord has given both him and Oholiab the ability to teach others.

"So now, there were so many others who were learning and helping too.

(Hold up two small gift bags, and place them on the table. Pull out the two pads of different colored sticky notes. Place a few of both colors of sticky notes on the posterboard in the lines of the heart. Leave room for the other colors.)

"More people joined in, and the tabernacle, God's house, began to take shape.

"But God did even more! God didn't just give people the abilities to get the job done—He gave them the materials too. And the Bible says the

people gave from the materials they had. This wasn't a project for just a few important people. Everyone chipped in!

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 35:21 NlrV.)

"Everyone who wanted to give offerings to the Lord brought them to him. The offerings were for the work on the tent of meeting. They were also for the sacred clothes and for any other purpose at the tent."

"That means people brought what they had. The Bible says some people brought fabric. Some people brought wood. Some people brought jewelry. Some people brought leather. Some people brought spices and olive oil. God had given the people these things, and they gave them right back to help with building the tabernacle.

"God had given people the gift of materials, and they brought those too!

(Hold up two small gift bags, and place them on the table. Pull out the two pads of different colored sticky notes. Place a few of both colors of sticky notes on the posterboard in the lines of the heart. Leave the heart nearly complete with a few sticky notes missing.)

"Look at the beautiful creation everyone has contributed to! *(Gesture to the incomplete posterboard.)*

"Let's tune back into the Bible Story. Because—after everyone brought their skills and abilities and materials—listen to what happened next.

(Open the Bible and read Exodus 39:42-43 NlrV.)

The Israelites had done all the work just as the Lord had commanded Moses. Moses looked over the work carefully. He saw that the workers had done it just as the Lord had commanded. So Moses gave them his blessing.

"Moses looked at the tabernacle and saw it was done the way God said. Not because one person was amazing, but because everyone played their part. That is how God builds. He uses a whole community of people who follow Him to further His kingdom.

"God brought a whole community together—different gifts, different people, different possessions—for one purpose. As everyone used their gifts together, something incredible was built. Not just a building, but something much bigger—a place where God Himself would live among His people."

God Has Given You Gifts

"Just like Bezalel, Oholiab, the skilled workers, and all of the people who contributed materials to the tabernacle, God has given you gifts and abilities and possessions and everything you have.

"This gift—these abilities, whatever God has given you—they're not just for you. They're for God and others. God wants us to use our gifts together, just like the Israelites did when building the tabernacle. Because when we use our gifts for Him, something incredible happens.

(Finish using the sticky notes in random colors to fill in the outline of the heart. Feel free to overlap the sticky notes as you fill in the heart!)

"Use your gifts—whatever God has given you. It could be skills, gifts, or even what you have! But no matter what they are, when we all use our gifts together, we can help build something amazing that shows people who God is. This heart reminds me of love—God's love! And when we use whatever God has given us, we can show the world His love!"

Wrapping up the Story

STORYTELLER: "Wow! What an amazing story! God gave special gifts to people like Bezalel and Oholiab. They were artists and builders, and God helped them do something big—build a beautiful place where people could worship Him.

"And they didn't do it alone! God brought more people to help. And He even provided all of the materials! Everyone worked together to build something wonderful for God.

"This true story from the Bible shows us something really cool—when people say yes to God, and when they use the special things He's given them, something amazing happens. It's not just about doing something fun or cool. It's about being part of God's big story.

"God used the gifts of His people to build the tabernacle—a special place to meet with Him. And today, God still uses people to do big things—kids too!

"Our Bottom Line for today also talks about this! Let's see what it says.

SLIDE: Bottom Line

[Bottom Line] "God grows His gifts in me to build His kingdom. Can you say that with me?"

(Host enters and joins in.)

KIDS, STORYTELLER, AND HOST: **[Bottom Line]** "God grows His gifts in me to build His kingdom."

WHAT'S OUR PART IN THE STORY?

HOST: "The things God has given you—your abilities, your time, your possessions—are not random. God has given you exactly what you need for the life He's placed you in. Just like God's people had the job of building the tabernacle, you have the job of showing God's good, beautiful heart.

"You don't have to wait until you're older. You don't have to be perfect. You just have to be willing. Because when you bring what God has given you to Him, no matter how small it seems, He makes it part of something so much bigger.

"Maybe you're really good at helping others. Or maybe you love to play basketball. Maybe you love to draw, or build, or sing, or solve problems. Maybe you have an extra pair of shoes you can give away. Whatever God has given you, God wants you to use it, not just to do something fun or cool, but to help others and show His love.

"When you use your gift to serve others, something amazing happens: People see God and His goodness!

"So when you're kind to a friend, when you help someone, when you create something that shows others who God is, or when you share something you have, you're contributing your gift and building something beautiful, just like this beautiful heart. *(Gesture to the sticky note heart on the posterboard.)*

"You might not see it right away, but God does. He sees how you're using what He gave you, and He's cheering you on!

"Let's talk to the God who loves to build something beautiful from your gifts!"
