# Seeds of Faithfulness

One day, my father-in-law called me. He told me he had been listening to a radio program where a chaplain was talking about ministry in Cook County Jail and was looking for volunteers. He said, "Dan, you need to do this." I didn't know what to expect, but I went to observe a Bible study at the jail. From the moment it began, I felt the prompting of the Holy Spirit. I knew this was something I was supposed to do.

During that time, a few of the men that I was working with began to talk with others about what I was doing. Eventually, I was invited to lunch with our founders: "If we provide the seed money, would you go into this ministry full-time?" I prayed about it, we met several times, and we all felt peace about moving forward.

In 1994, Chicagoland Prison Outreach was born.

In CPO's early days, I was going into the jail five days a week, leading Bible studies, doing one-on-one discipleship, and meeting with men who wanted to grow in their faith. From the very beginning, it was all about discipleship. Over time, others joined the work. We added staff and volunteers, began serving in new facilities, and expanded beyond the walls of Cook County. I still look back and marvel at how God multiplied it all. What started with one person has become a movement of many, each one helping others grow in faith.

If I had to sum up CPO's ministry philosophy in two words, it would be faithfulness and intentionality. Over the years, I've learned they go hand in hand: to be faithful, you have to be intentional. And to be intentional, you have to be faithful. Those two words have guided CPO. Whether we're teaching, mentoring, or serving, our goal is to stay faithful to God's call and to do everything with purpose.

My hope for the next 30 years of CPO is simple: stay faithful to the call. I'm grateful beyond words to see Corey carrying that banner so well. I don't worry about the future because I know the mission is in good hands. If Christ took me home tomorrow, nothing would change in the advancement of the kingdom. That's how confident I am in the team God has raised up. The seeds planted long ago are still growing - and they're being replanted every day in new hearts, new facilities, and new families.

Looking back, I never could have imagined how one phone call would lead to this. But God takes small beginnings and grows them into something lasting. CPO's story is proof of that. It's been a joy to watch these seeds of faith grow into a garden of grace - tended by so many hands, watered by prayer, and rooted deeply in God's love.

## Bearing Much Fruit

Since stepping into this role in May, my heart has been filled with gratitude, not only for the amazing work God is doing through CPO, but also for you, our faithful partners who make this ministry possible. Truly, "The Lord has done great things for us, and we are filled with joy" (Psalm 126:3).



At CPO, we take seriously Jesus' command in Matthew 22:36–40 to love God and love our neighbor. For us, our neighbors are men and women who are incarcerated or returning home. Because of your prayers and generosity, they are experiencing God's grace, finding restored hope, renewing their families, and beginning a new life in Christ; spiritually and vocationally.

Already, your support is bearing much fruit. Families are being strengthened, disciples are being made, and men and women are being equipped with both faith and skills for sustainable work. Some of our Career Center alumni are now hiring recent graduates which is a multiplying cycle of transformation. The Kingdom impact is tangible as lives are stepping from darkness into His marvelous light.

This impact is eternal, but it is also deeply practical. Illinois spends nearly \$50,000 each year to incarcerate one individual. Last year, 25 CPO graduates secured union jobs these men and women now contributing to their families, churches, and communities instead of returning to prison. The difference between incarceration costs and what they now generate in earnings and taxes could exceed \$2 million in just one year. Imagine this impact multiplied threefold, that could mean over \$25 million in community benefit by 2030, and far more importantly, countless lives transformed for Christ's Kingdom!

Looking ahead, we believe the Lord is calling us to triple our capacity in the next 3–5 years, multiplying Bible studies, strengthening more families, and equipping even more men and women for lifelong discipleship and meaningful employment.

## DIGITAL MARKETING CLASS IN EVANSTON

Thanks to your generosity, something truly inspiring is happening in our Digital Marketing class in Evanston. Justice-involved individuals and their families are now taking bold steps to rebuild their lives and businesses, one lesson at a time.

Just this week, they practiced writing engaging captions, using hashtags to reach wider audiences, and crafting meaningful calls-to-action—real skills that open doors to economic independence and brighter futures.
