ANNOUNCEMENTS

1) BOY SCOUT BBQ FUNDRAISER | Our Boy Scout Troop 266 will host its annual BBQ at the end of the July 4th parade in Dunwoody Village. Funds are used to purchase and maintain scout equipment, buy training materials, and provide need-based scholarships. Tickets are \$13 in advance and \$15 on parade day. The meal includes shredded bbq sandwich (chicken or pork), chips, sides, and a drink (water, tea, or lemonade). Scouts will sell tickets today before and after services in both the Sanctuary and Activity Building porticoes.

2) PATRIOTIC CONCERT | The Music Ministry of Dunwoody UMC will celebrate the 250th Birthday of the United States with a concert today at 4:00 p.m. in our sanctuary. In honor of the historic anniversary of the Declaration of Independence, the Chancel Choir will present "The Testament of Freedom" by American composer Randall Thompson, accompanied by organ, percussion, and brass ensemble. The piece was originally commissioned by the University of Virginia to celebrate the 200th birthday of Thomas Jefferson, using the text of several of his writings. The concert will feature a variety of additional patriotic and American music as we honor our servicemen and women and pay tribute to our country's rich history. The concert is free and open to the public.

3) MISSION MONDAYS | Gather together in the DUMC Gym for Mission Monday service opportunities at 6:30 p.m. on June 29 and July 20.
