Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe

From the Desk of Father Trowbridge



It is a blessing to be back with you in prayer. I am grateful to the several priests who were so helpful by leading you in prayer while I took some time for prayer and study before our holiday season!

This Sunday we celebrate in a very jubilant manner. This is true for every Sunday when we gather to keep the sabbath holy and to remember the resurrection of Jesus. This Sunday it is elevated because we both conclude the liturgical year and we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This is the only event that we celebrate in our liturgical cycle that has not occurred in history; rather, it is an event that we look forward to with great hope.

There is an extreme story of a young saint that highlights persevering in God despite great earthly pressure to turn away from Him. Our Saint is Philomena, her name means *little daughter of the light*.

Philomena's parents were not able to conceive, they had asked a Christian friend to "pray to your God that we may have a child." The friend replied "become baptized and I will pray." Philomena's parents took instruction in the faith, were baptized, and soon after they had conceived their first and only child, a daughter, whom they named Philomena. Baptism was known as the sacrament of light, a reference to the light of God's truth shining on the baptized person. Fast forward thirteen years, Philomena's father had to travel from Greece, where he was a military leader and ruler, and request military support from the emperor of Rome. His wife and daughter joined him on this critical imperial mission.

When the Emperor Dioceletian saw the young Philomena he was smitten and requested her hand in marriage. If it were granted then he would give her father all the military resources he needed to preserve his region.

Philomena refused because she knew she was being requested on account of appetite and not virtue. Her parents pleaded with her. She refused because she had promised fidelity and purity to the Lord and she would not turn from Our Lord. Her parents then insulted her and cursed her for betraying her homeland and family. She stood firm. The parents who begged God and converted that she may be conceived, parents who celebrated her birth with a beautiful name giving honor to God's light, now treated her harshly for her faithfulness.

They left her with the emperor. Diocletian granted her father the military resources. For the next several days the emperor sought to bribe Philomena, when this did not work she was threatened and finally was tortured. In the third day of her torture she went unto the Lord. She maintained Christ as King in her life. She refused to supplant Him.

While none of us stand before a Roman Emperor, there are a lot of ways we are pressured to abandon Our Lord, His teachings, or the values of our Catholic family. We must be sons and daughters of prayer. Our strength must be the Eucharist. Let us strive with humility and love to keep God first in all things. Long live Christ the King!

I am so thankful that our volunteers are teaming up to coordinate a thanksgiving food drive AND collaborate with our local resources to populate a Giving Tree to assist the families in our own local communities.


