Dear Parishioners & Luests!

We have been blessed on this Holy Sabbath to unite with Our Lord and one another. If we focus on God's blessings, we are lifted up in gratitude. If we focus on all the intense events and circumstances of our world, we can become discouraged and weary. *Virtue lies in the middle*, quoting St. Thomas Aquinas. We have to strike a balance. Our prayers on Sunday, at our sacred altar, helps us to strike this balance. I pray that you may drink deeply from the fount of God's grace today in the Mass!

As our bulletin cover indicates this month is dedicated to Respect Life. As such, our prayers and opportunities to gather will recall in a prioritized manner our need to advocate for every human life in every circumstance. This is not an easy posture, and for us as Catholics, we occupy a thin ribbon of advocacy. Our core teaching is very precise and it rooted in Christ. The difficulty is getting pulled into other momentum of advocacy that can depart from the gospel. There are religious extremes that are manifest as well as partisan extremes which want to claim validity by adding religion to their charge. remember the verse: "you have said Lord, Lord, but I do not know you, depart from me." (cf. Mt 7:21-23) We must not get swept into a worldly allegiance which draws us from Christ, at times we may need to stand apart from others, for we shall always remain with the Lord, for we know Him!

This month is also dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This prayer which was given to St. Dominic by Our Blessed Mother is a multi-layered prayer which ties us closely to the special moments of salvation history. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th this is the feast which anchors this month in praying the rosary.

If the rosary has been a prayer that you have been meaning to learn, to pray more often or to pray daily then let October be a month that you make this holy intention a higher priority. You may want to join us before every Mass on Sat/Sun for the rosary 30 minutes before Mass -OR- you can join us every weekday after daily Mass.

The rosary is affectionately known as the school of Mary, the ladder to heaven and the scourge of Satan. We may not have the resources to outmaneuver every difficulty in life but with Mary's intercession we can be guided through many obstacles unscathed.

On the week of October 13th the Knights will be coordinating the Sacred Heart Icon of Jesus to be on display in our church for the week and through the weekend of the 19th.

Our gospel this Sunday connects the vibrance of our faith to the recognition of our duty to honor God. Distractions arise when we prefer our own way instead of God's or when we become so occupied with our events and activities that we have no time left for God. We strive to guard against these pitfalls that we may be strengthened by God's grace, vibrant in our faith!

I hope you can join us for the rosary!

From the Desk of Deacon Brian Mullins



At the wedding feast in Cana, Mary quietly noticed what no one else saw: the jars were empty, the joy of the celebration was in danger of fading. She did not draw attention to herself, but turned all eyes to her Son. With trust, she simply said, "Do whatever He tells you." And in that moment of faith, the ordinary became extraordinary, water turned to wine, and hearts were filled with wonder.

So too is the role of our parish prayer warriors for those journeying through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). Like Mary, you are attentive to the hidden needs. You stand beside our catechumens and candidates not on a stage, but in the quiet offering of prayer. You intercede when their jars of courage run dry, when questions grow heavy, or when the journey feels long.

Your prayers are like Mary's gentle words—pointing not to yourselves, but to Christ. You help draw their gaze to the One who can change everything, the One who can transform doubt into faith, fear into trust, and searching into belonging.

In this sacred work, you are woven into their conversion story. Though unseen, your presence is essential. Every whispered prayer, every rosary bead, every intention offered is a thread of grace in their lives.

Like Cana, the feast of faith is richer because you are here, listening with Mary, interceding with love, and pointing to Jesus.
