


From the Desk of Father Trowbridge



Dear Parishioners & Guests!

It is a blessing for us to pray together. We are a family of faith fed by the Lord. When we pray together we are fed by the Word of God, by His Precious Body and Blood. We are edified and supported by our fellow parishioners who are "fighting the good fight" by our side.

As a priest I am brought joy when we pray together at Mass. Jesus asked us to "Do this in memory of Me," when He was with the Apostles at the Last Supper. At every Mass, we do! It is good to follow the instruction of the Lord.

I am grateful to Deacon Bill for preaching last weekend on the gift of our faith. One point that he made regarding our faith is that it is fed when we live it out. What is the point of having our faith if it does not direct the way that we live. I am glad he made this point because every person needs to be encouraged in what they are doing already and motivated to continue this good work for others.

This Sunday is the second week of Respect Life month and is one of the avenues in which the Catholic Church is active in our diocese, state, nation and world. As Catholics we really need to know what the Church teaches on the topics of Respect Life and why she teaches what she does.

Statistically we know people who have made life decisions that are contrary to the Church's teaching regarding the dignity of life. It is possible that your own family or even you have made a life decision contrary to these teachings. As a priest this would not be a surprise because our earthly path has many opportunities and circumstances that point us down

an imperfect path. When the Church elaborates on her teaching it is not to shame those who have acted imperfectly, it is to indicate where the steepest pitfalls in life are so that we may avoid stumbling and falling into them in the future. In Christian charity we also strive to assist our family members and neighbors in avoiding these pitfalls. When we do not respect the gift of life we increase injury in the human family and we create a fracture between us and God.

Clarity in the church's teaching helps us to connect with God and turn to Him for healing where spiritual or physical injury has been present. Many times people avoid learning what the Church teaches out of fear, pride or hate. Regarding fear, we do not know what we will learn and it is easier not to know for if I learn something that I am in violation of i fear the need to change. Regarding pride, we avoid learning what the Church teaches because we have created a path in life that we like and, frankly, we don't care what God wants. We would rather do our thing on our terms and sort out the details later. Regarding hatred, we avoid learning what the Church teaches because we despise the fact that the church would even teach "this or that" and a person is willing to persist in hating the Church for what they think she teaches, rather than learning what the Church teaches and why it is so.

Jesus, in speaking to the Jews who believed in Him shared the following, "If you remain in my Word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." [Jn 8:31-32] The Church is the steward of Jesus' Word, her teaching is faithful to His. This, we strive, in faith, to follow what the Church teaches, not on our terms, but as a child of faith seeking to follow God in all things.



Sacraments

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is to be celebrated at different times of illness:

- 1) when a person becomes ill
- 2) when a persisting illness gets worse
- 3) before any surgery
- 4) when death is immanent

This celebration of the sacrament seeks physical recovery and spiritual strength during the healing journey. God's grace at this time is a comfort to the soul.

There is a final celebration of Anointing of the Sick which is before death when the recipient is still alert and can receive Holy Communion. This is Anointing and Viaticum. Viaticum refers to the final reception of Holy Communion before going to the Lord.

Something special during this celebration is the Apostolic Pardon. This is a prayer connected to absolution which forgives the time a soul is due to endure in purgatory. This is a permission given by the Holy See as an act of the Church's mercy for souls close to death. Always ask a priest for the Apostolic Pardon!

Many times in my priesthood I have been asked to anoint a parishioner and they were non-responsive, sedated and unable to be alert for the sacrament. Tell your family, "If I go to the hospital, call father. I want to be anointed when I am alert and aware!"

If you or someone you know is not alert or aware during the anointing of the sick, that is okay. you can have them anointed. It certainly still counts as a validly celebrated sacrament.

Marriage

This sacrament is the foundation of family life and is always celebrated as a sacrament in our Catholic life. Couples planning to be married should contact the parish before finalizing with their reception venue. At a minimum, contact the parish six months prior to your proposed wedding date.

Baptism

Please baptize your children as soon as possible. Parents seeking baptism for their child must bring a copy of the birth certificate to the parish office and register for a baptism preparation class. Classes are held on the second Sunday of the month following the 10:00 a.m. Mass.
