

From the Desk of Father Trowbridge



During this week we have been blessed with a special opportunity to pray with a traveling image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This image is a replica of an original which has been on display in Rome for many centuries.

An artist with great faith can convey rich beauty in their work when their join the gift of their faith with their talent and craft an image of a holy moment or holy people from our tradition of faith. Pope Saint John Paul II indicated this in his "Letter to Artists" as he extends his gratitude to the many talented artists who have helped us to pray on account of the holy and beautiful art in our churches throughout the centuries!

On our bulletin cover we have another holy image, a scene from Gethsemane on Holy Thursday. This does not correlate with our readings specifically but is a monumental moment that connects with the theme of persevering in prayer.

When I was a student in Rome I recall Pope Benedict XVI sharing his insights on prayer during a homily to theology students. He summarized his thoughts by saying, "Prayer is hard, we must persevere." This was an impacting moment, a pope who wrote so beautifully and with such great insight, surely a faithful son of prayer, sharing with us that prayer is hard!

From the words of an honest pope through the insights from our readings and Jesus' example in Gethsemane, we are encouraged to remain determined in our prayer. Sometimes our schedule is demanding. Sometimes our soul does not want to

hear what God has to say, knowing we are called to make a change. Whatever the obstacle may be, we must be steadfast in prayer. It is our life line to God in this life as we strive toward the eternal splendor of heaven and seek to guide souls similarly!

We continue with our reflection, prayer and learning for Respect Life month. All people of good will, and especially Catholics, are called to respect life *from the moment of conception until natural death*. Last weekend I preached on the dignity of life from conception to birth and the compassion we must have for every human life involved. I quoted CCC 2270 which reads, "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person - among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life." This truth must guide our intellect and our passions.

This week I want to draw our attention to the other end of the earthly life spectrum and that is honoring the dignity of life all the way to natural death. The US Bishops have a great document which is free online entitled, *Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Healthcare Services*, sixth-edition.

This document, in its fifth chapter, elaborates on care for the seriously ill and dying. This text guides our understanding in that difficult moment of balance for our loved ones when they are in their last days. When can you accept and reject treatment options? When can extraordinary means of life support may be removed? What elements of life support must never be removed? How do you administer painkillers during palliative care? These points of guidance help us to walk with our loved ones while respecting their eternal dignity. Life is a gift, and we are its stewards. Always reach out if you have questions for yourself or a loved one!
