From the Desk of Father Trowbridge



Dear Parishioners & Guests,

I am grateful for your presence and your attention to the life of our parish. It is a blessing to be gathered around our holy altar during the great joy of this Christmas season. So many of you have shared your gratitude regarding the beauty of our Church as our decorations are on full display. I am grateful that the Lord has blessed us with such a beautiful place to pray.

During advent we remember that the church decorations and celebration was limited as we “tightened our spiritual belt” to get work done in preparation for the great feasts surrounding the Birth of Jesus. One of the ways that we scaled back our prayer was by omitting the Gloria from our Sunday prayer. We fast from this prayer for a time so that its vibrance may ring out all the more on the day of Christ’s Birth. We recall the gospel detailing the song of heaven as the angels sing “Glory to God in the highest and peace to all people of good will.” When we pray at Mass we are extremely close to heaven. When we sing the gloria we are singing in unison with that rank of angels who sing of God’s glory perpetually in heaven. How beautiful!

Even though Christmas is in the rearview mirror for some families, for our families in the Catholic Church we are still in the midst of the Joy and Glory of Jesus’ Nativity! Today we celebrate the Epiphany, the great feast which recollects the light of Christ shining upon the faces of the Magi, those three wise men who, although not members of the

chosen people, sought Christ with the wisdom available to them. They came prepared with gifts for the Lord Jesus. These international sojourners were respectful of the lands in which they entered as we see in their visit to King Herod. There is a detail in this Sunday’s gospel that caught my attention. When the Magi arrived at the manger they were “*overjoyed*” as they approached Jesus. Conversely, when King Herod heard of Jesus he was “*greatly troubled and all of Jerusalem with him.*” This a reminder to me that not all people are excited to hear about the birth of Our Lord and are threatened by His presence. This is a great sadness to God because He has provided every human sufficient grace to attain heaven. By our baptism we are united with Christ and His mission to serve every human person according to gospel charity that every soul may be shepherded toward God and ultimately eternal life. We can only engage in this shepherding with Our Lord if we attend to our unity with Jesus. In the joy of this season draw very closely to Our Lord that you may be filled with His truth and love and with these blessings upon you, use them to serve every person that God brings into your life.

Respect Life Prayers & Activities arise in January within many Catholic circles on account of the anniversary of *Roe v. Wade*. While this decision has been overturned in *Dobbs v. Jackson* many prayers are still needed for the preborn and their mothers. If this is a difficult topic for you, know you are not alone and that the Church has many avenues of wisdom and support.

Home Blessings - get your epiphany home blessing kit in the church or parish office - May the wise men who adored our lord in Bethlehem garner protection for your home and all your loved ones!

Sacraments



Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is to be celebrated at different times of illness:

- 1) when a person becomes ill
- 2) when a persisting illness gets worse
- 3) before any surgery
- 4) when death is immanent

This celebration of the sacrament seeks physical recovery and spiritual strength during the healing journey. God's grace at this time is a comfort to the soul.

There is a final celebration of Anointing of the Sick which is before death when the recipient is still alert and can receive Holy Communion. This is Anointing and Viaticum. Viaticum refers to the final reception of Holy Communion before going to the Lord.

Something special during this celebration is the Apostolic Pardon. This is a prayer connected to absolution which forgives the time a soul is due to endure in purgatory. This is a permission given by the Holy See as an act of the Church's mercy for souls close to death. Always ask a priest for the Apostolic Pardon!

Many times in my priesthood I have been asked to anoint a parishioner and they were non-responsive, sedated and unable to be alert for the sacrament. Tell your family, "***If I go to the hospital, call father. I want to be anointed when I am alert and aware!***"

If you or someone you know is not alert or aware during the anointing of the sick, that is okay. you can have them anointed. It certainly still counts as a validly celebrated sacrament.

Marriage

This sacrament is the foundation of family life and is always celebrated as a sacrament in our Catholic life. Couples planning to be married should contact the parish before finalizing with their reception venue. At a minimum, contact the parish six months prior to your proposed wedding date.

Baptism

Please baptize your children as soon as possible. Parents seeking baptism for their child must bring a copy of the birth certificate to the parish office and register for a baptism preparation class. Classes are held on the second Sunday of the month following the 10:00 a.m. Mass.
