

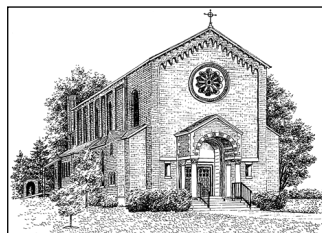

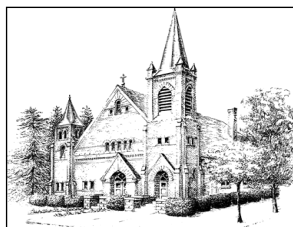

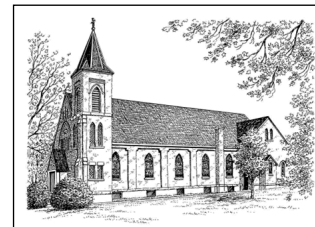

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Following up on my article from two weeks ago on Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and the brown scapular, I wanted to give the prayers associated with the blessing and imposition of the scapular. The prayers are good to know, partly because the prayers show us the purpose of the scapular, and partly because they are just simply beautiful.

When I impose the scapular on someone, the form in the ritual I use is done in Latin, and the one to receive the scapular is kneeling (if possible), and it begins:

V. Show us, O Lord, your mercy.
 R. And grant us your salvation.
 V. O Lord, hear my prayer.
 R. And let my cry come to you.
 V. The Lord be with you.
 R. And with your spirit.

1. Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, with your right hand make + holy this habit which, for love of you and of your Mother, the Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel, your servant will wear with devotion. By the intercession of your Mother may he be defended against the wicked enemy and persevere until death in your grace. Who live and reign forever and ever.

The above prayer is just the blessing of the scapular itself, which shows the power and intention of taking this little habit. The Mother of God herself takes this person under her care until his final breath.

The scapular is sprinkled with holy water and the priest places the scapular on the person, saying:

2. Receive this blessed habit and ask the most holy Virgin that by her merits you may wear it without stain and that it may defend you against every adversity and bring you to life everlasting. R. Amen.

3. By the power committed to me, I admit you to a participation in all the spiritual good works performed, through the merciful help of Jesus Christ, by the religious of Mount Carmel. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, + and of the Holy Spirit. R. Amen.

4. May Almighty God, maker of heaven and earth, bless + you, he who has received you into the Confraternity of the blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel. We beg her to crush the head of the serpent of old at the hour of your death, that you may obtain the palm and the crown of the everlasting inheritance. R. Amen.

With these prayers, we now have the benefits of the promises that Mary first gave to St. Simon Stock. You see the word “Confraternity” in the final prayer here. A confraternity is, generally, a group of people united around a common purpose, who support each other spiritually, socially, and financially. It is a voluntary community. The history of medieval confraternities and guilds is an interesting one.

What this prayer is saying is that, by taking this little habit, we are taking part in a community of people, not bound together by family ties, or by physical proximity, but by faith and common spiritual practices. We are already bound together in the Body of Christ, but this practice further binds us together in a specific way, and therefore allows us to receive further benefits from those in the confraternity, under the mantle of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Wearing the scapular is a constant reminder of who Mary is for us. Our Mother has come to clothe us with her own clothes. Throughout the centuries God has reminded us, through the appearances of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that we have the help of heaven whenever we ask (and even when we do not ask!). At all times, but most especially in times of doubt and temptation, we can look to the scapular, and hold it, as a reminder of who we belong to, who we trust, and in whose hands we are held, protected and fortified.

May the Virgin Mary, with her loving Child, bless us!

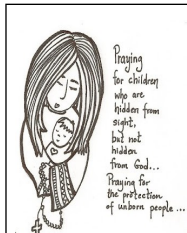

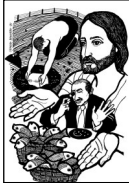

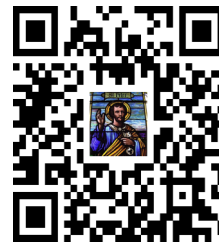

Mission Appeal

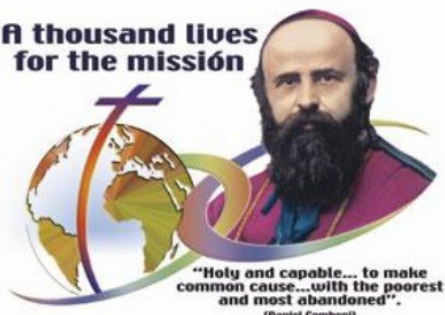
This weekend, our Parish is participating in the Mission appeal initiative organized by the Missionary Cooperative Plan of our Diocese.
