

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

This past week we celebrated the Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel, and Rafael, Archangels (September 29), and the Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels (October 2). Besides the help we receive from our Guardian Angels, we have the help of our Mother Mary, Queen of Angels. This week we also celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, formerly called Our Lady of Victory. On October 7, 1571, a sea battle took place that was to determine who controlled the Mediterranean Sea, and therefore at least southern Europe. The Muslim forces were threatening to advance further into Europe and their victory seemed inevitable given their naval superiority.

Pope Pius V, a Dominican, knew the power of the holy Rosary and the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. He formed the Holy League as the fleet that would be tasked with saving Christian Civilization. Throughout Italy, the churches were filled with the faithful praying the Rosary. On the ships, before the battle, the soldiers were also praying the Rosary, going to confession, fasting, and making all manner of spiritual preparation for a battle that was more than merely a military conflict.

The Turkish fleet had every advantage on the morning of the battle. As the conflict was about to begin, the Christian fleet were rowing against the wind while the Turks had full sails. Then the Mother of God intervened. The wind shifted completely, and the Christian forces now had the wind. They unfurled their battle standard given by Pius V: a giant bright blue banner with the image of the Crucified Lord. It is a long story, but heaven intervened and the Holy League won, leaving only 13 of the 300 Turkish ships left. With 30,000 of the Turks killed in battle, the world would not see such casualties again in a single day until World War I.

Besides the Rosary being prayed and Masses offered, there was another sign that this was Mary's victory. Exactly 40 years earlier, Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared in Mexico and imprinted her miraculous image on the tilma. At that time, the bishop had five replicas made and touched each one to the original. One of those images was on a ship that went into battle. Mary was there. In commemoration of this victory, and in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, this feast day was established to remind us that we always have the help of Heaven in this battle of earthly life.

How the Rosary came to be as we know it today is a long story, but tradition affirms for us that it was Mary herself who gave the Rosary to St. Dominic to assist him in preaching the Gospel and converting people back to the Faith. How would the Rosary do this?

Each decade of the Rosary allows us time to meditate on some aspect of the Life of Christ, some mystery of our Faith. Remember, in the 13th century, during St. Dominic's life, people did not have access to books. They needed simple ways to know the life of Christ outside of the sermons they heard. If someone like St. Dominic would preach about the Rosary to them, they would have an easy way to remember the various mysteries of the Faith and to contemplate them. Of course, by using the "Angelic Salutation," "Hail Mary, full of grace...," we use the same words given by God Himself to the Angel Gabriel, in order to call upon the help of our Mother for all our needs.



In today's world, our need for a simple, yet profound way to meditate on the Life of Christ and to call upon our Mother, is more obvious than ever. People often complain that they get easily distracted during the Rosary, or they ask, "Do I meditate on that particular mystery, or do I concentrate on the words of the prayer?" The answer is, "both." Sure, we should try to eliminate distractions by being in a place that is conducive to prayer, but if we wait until our minds are completely empty of all other thoughts, we will never begin prayer! These prayers allow us to fill our minds, if even for a moment, with good and holy things: the Life of Christ, and the praise of our Mother Mary.

In this month of the Most Holy Rosary, let us all re-commit to praying the Rosary. Even if we begin by praying just one decade each day, God will be pleased. And please remember to pray for me, as I always pray for all of you.


