

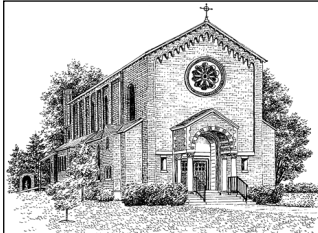

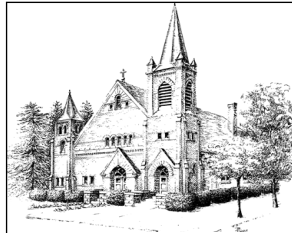

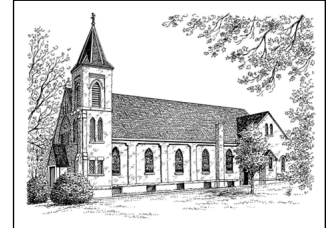

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Now that Lent is upon us, beginning this week with Ash Wednesday, I encourage you to take part in the many opportunities that we are providing for prayer, fellowship, and community throughout this season:

1. Stations of the Cross each Friday of Lent (plenary indulgence attached to this devotion)
2. Soup Supper following Stations on four of those Fridays
3. St. Joseph Table celebration

These are all in addition to the usual times of Eucharistic Adoration and Confession that are regularly available. I am very excited about this Lenten Season. Besides opportunities for us to come together, the above events are tremendous *opportunities to invite others, even those who may not be Catholic*. I understand that to someone who is not Catholic, or who has not been to Mass in a while, Mass can be intimidating, especially if they are not receiving Communion. The above events are all ways we can share some part of our Faith with anyone we know who is interested.

Just as Christ spent 40 days in the desert, tempted by Satan (Matthew 4:1-11), so we take these 40 days of Lent for our time of discipline and spiritual growth. Of course, we are always to be disciplined and seeking to grow throughout the year, but the Church knows human nature well, and she has given us a definite period of time to “hit the reset button” and begin again, wherever we happen to be in our journey. From our own experience, we know we will “get to work” when we have a deadline.

Among the disciplines of Lent, fasting and abstinence from meat (and other foods you may choose) are important for our spiritual growth. There are a few reasons for this. First, we want to be deliberate about our actions, the things we choose, whether food or otherwise. We do not want to merely be led by our passions and emotions. By choosing things from which to abstain, when we feel like eating those things or doing those things, we have to say, “No, I am going to choose something else.” And so, we demonstrate our freedom, and our reason guides us.

Second, saying ‘no’ to things that may be legitimate for us, even if just for a time, trains us to say ‘no’ to things that are not good for us. We say ‘no’ to some things so that we can ‘yes’ to something else, something greater. For example, instead of watching our favorite news show, pick up a good book that will help you grow in some understanding of our Faith and in the spiritual life. I can give many recommendations. Also, take the time for Mass during the week, Adoration, and Confession. Lent is not just about removing things from our life, but adding prayer and other practices as well.

It is important to be reminded of our fasting and abstinence obligations during Lent as well. While many may not be required to fast due to age, I would still recommend it as you are able, and to offer it for the conversion of all those who live in our parish:

- We must abstain from flesh meat on **Ash Wednesday** and all **Fridays of Lent**
 - This applies to everyone age 14 and older
- We must fast on **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**
 - This applies to everyone age 18 to 59 inclusive
 - Fasting means we can eat one full meal and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal

There is much to which we look forward in the Easter Season, but first we must pass through the long Lent and prepare our hearts and minds to worthily celebrate that glorious day of Easter. One of the most distinctive features of the Lenten Season is the suppression of the “Alleluia” at Mass. Dom Prosper Guéranger describes what this means for us:

“It was, therefore, necessary that we should be put on our guard against the allurements of our place of exile. It is with this view that the Church, taking pity on our blindness and our dangers, gives us this solemn warning. By taking from us our *Alleluia*, she virtually tells us that our lips must first be cleansed, before they again be permitted to utter this word of angels and saints; and that our hearts, defiled as they are by sin and attachment to earthly things, must be purified by penance. She is going to put before our eyes the sad spectacle of the fall of our first parents, that dire event whence came all our woes, and our need of Redemption. This tender mother weeps over us, and would have us weep with her.”

We have a lot of good things going on this season at the parish as we prepare for Easter. We will pray for each other, that we all have a holy Lent.

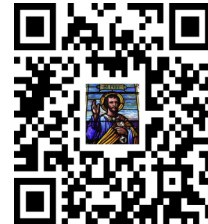
