

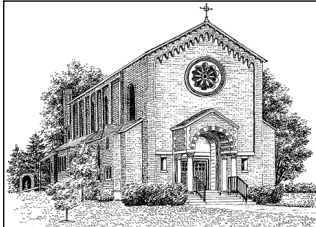

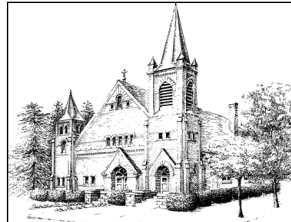

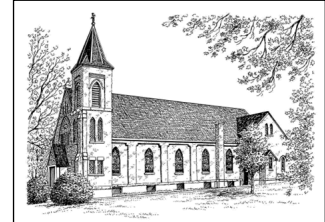

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

As we approach All Saints Day and All Souls Day, and the special plenary indulgences that can be gained for the dead, it is a good time to be reminded of the Church's teaching on this topic.

Before we talk about indulgences directly, we must have a concept of sin and its consequences. In the first few years following the Second Vatican Council, Pope Paul VI took the opportunity to restate and reaffirm many of the Church's teachings and disciplines. In 1967, he promulgated his Apostolic Constitution *Indulgentiarum Doctrina* which reformed the practice of indulgences while restating the Church's perennial teaching.

Paul VI begins by pointing out basic doctrine on sin: "It is a divinely revealed truth that sins bring punishments inflicted by God's sanctity and justice. These must be expiated either on this earth through the sorrows, miseries and calamities of this life and above all through death, or else in the life beyond through fire and torments or 'purifying' punishments. Therefore it has always been the conviction of the faithful that the paths of evil are fraught with many stumbling blocks and bring adversities, bitterness and harm to those who follow them" (*Indulgentiarum doctrina*, 2).

I am sure many of you have been told, or have told others, to "offer it up" when someone is experiencing some pain or suffering. Pope Paul VI is reiterating that basic truth about the relationship between sin, punishment, and expiation. First, all sin harms the order of the world in some way (*ID*, 2). It is an offense to God's sanctity and justice. Therefore, the damage must be repaired. Since we are conscious of this fact, we can offer to God our sufferings in this life so as to lessen or eliminate our sufferings in Purgatory.

Second, we see in Genesis 3:19 that death was given as the final punishment to humanity for sin. St. Paul reiterates this in Romans 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death. But the grace of God, life everlasting, in Christ Jesus our Lord." Because of God's mercy, and the grace he has given us in Jesus, we are able to be forgiven and therefore restored to friendship with Him. And so, third, we see that the guilt of sin and the punishments that are due to us for our sins, are related, yet distinct (see *ID*, 3).

We must be cleansed of all grave sin, and therefore be in a state of grace, when we leave this earthly life, if we are to enjoy eternal beatitude with God. However, there may still be (and likely are) punishments for our sins yet to be expiated or cleansed upon our death. In God's infinite mercy and in His desire that we be absolutely spotless upon entering heavenly glory (Revelation 21:22-27), he allows those who die in a state of grace, and who are therefore destined for heaven, to be perfectly cleansed *after death*. This state of being, we call 'Purgatory.'

Pope Paul VI reminds us that "there reigns among men, by the hidden and benign mystery of the divine will, a supernatural solidarity whereby the sin of one harms the others just as the holiness of one also benefits the others" (*ID*, 4). We know this almost intuitively without needing any great learning or study. But we know this in a more profound way by divine revelation. The Apostle Paul is clear: "For if, by the transgression of one person, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one person Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so through one righteous act acquittal and life came to all" (Romans 5:17-18). So, we are bound together, first through the sin of Adam, but now through the Cross of Christ.

It has always been part of the Christian life that members of the Church would pray for each other, sacrifice for one another, and perform penitential acts for expiation of sins for themselves and others. By this exchange of spiritual goods, the faithful become more immersed in charity as they strive to imitate Christ and seek to participate in the salvation of their brethren. Within the Mystical Body of Christ, our lives are bound to one another, and this we call the "Communion of Saints" (*ID*, 5).

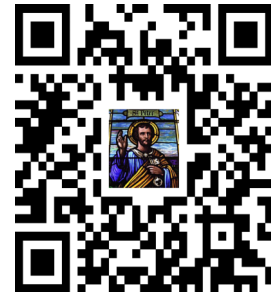

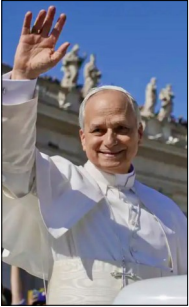
