
What Star Is This

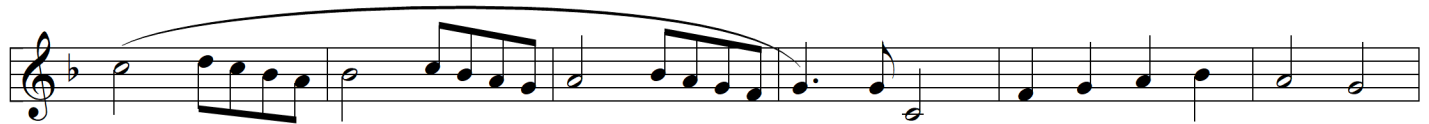

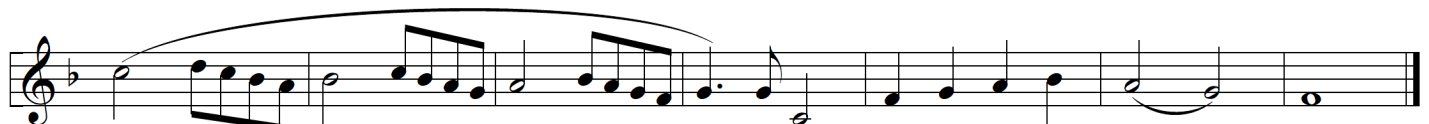

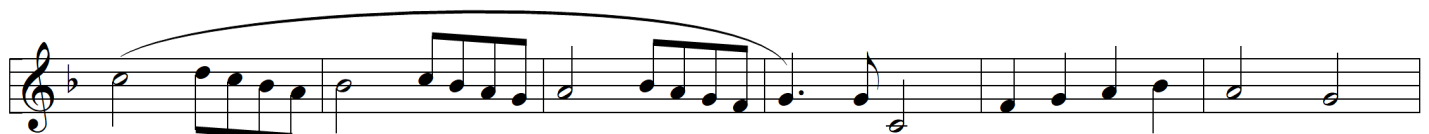
