Mary answered, "Let it be with me according to your word."

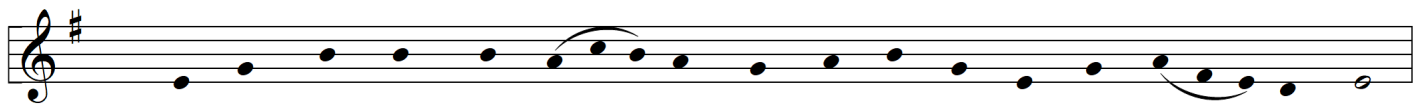
May her courage shape our courage,

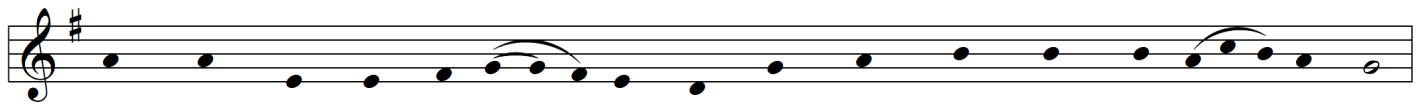

and with his blood mankind hath bought.


