A Word From the Pastor

“Review of Luke (first section)”

This morning, we will return to our study of the Gospel of Luke, which we began during Advent last year and paused for our Lenten series. If the Lord is willing, my plan is to continue in this book through the first few weeks of summer before pausing again for a study through the book of Jonah. As we pick up the story of Jesus' life again this morning, let's take a few moments to remember where Luke has brought us to so far.

The chapters we have covered so far can be broken down into 2 sections: Jesus' arrival and His preparation for ministry. From the very beginning of the Gospel, we are clued into the fact that God is doing something special. Two babies' births are foretold by angels. Mary visits Elizabeth where she is led to sing a beautiful song about God's work. And finally, John and Jesus are born. However, it is clear throughout this first section that the 2 babies are not equal. It is clear that both are great, but 1 is far greater. John will be the forerunner. Jesus is the Messiah.

After the birth stories, it becomes even more clear that Luke's story will focus primarily on Jesus. John doesn't disappear from the story. However, Jesus moves into the spotlight. As his younger years unfold, Luke continually presents Him as the promised Savior. Two people in Jerusalem, Simeon and Anna, declare that they have seen the Messiah when they lay their eyes on Jesus. Later, when Jesus returns to Jerusalem as an adolescent, the religious teachers are in awe at His understanding of God's Word. We then hear from God the Father declare that Jesus is the Son of God at His baptism. Finally, His identity is confirmed when He perfectly obeys The Father in the midst of Satan's temptations.

This morning, we will open God's Word to Luke 4:14. When you arrive at this point in Luke's story, you simply cannot get away from the message that Jesus is promised Messiah, Savior, and Son of God. For the next few weeks, Luke will focus on Jesus' mission. In other words, what did Jesus come to do as the Messiah, Savior, and Son of God. My prayer is that God will bless our time in His Word and that we will mature in His likeness.
