A Word from the Pastor

“Reflections After Jonah”

Over the past five weeks, we have studied our way through a book of the Old Testament for the first time in my tenure as Pastor of FBC Manning. As I have mentioned before, one of my goals in preaching is to regularly expose this congregation to all of the genres of Scripture in both the Old and New Testaments. As we enter the last installment in this series through Jonah, I would like to share a couple of reflections concerning the Old Testament that have been on my mind this week.

First, I have been reminded through Jonah that the Old Testament speaks clearly of Christ. While you will not necessarily find Christ in every single verse in the Old Testament, each book within it regularly points to Him. I would even argue that each major section or story in the Old Testament books point to Him. This should come as no surprise, as Jesus Himself makes this point in Luke 24:25-27. However, studying Jonah has refreshed this truth in my heart, which I am thankful for.

Secondly, I have also been reminded that the Old Testament contains some of the best story-telling, not just in Scripture, but in the entirety of literature! If you are ever struggling to read God’s Word or finding your devotional times to be dry, I would encourage you to search out an Old Testament book for a season. The prophetic books, along with narratives (Genesis, Exodus, 1-2 Samuel, etc.) are especially captivating in the stories they deliver.

Lastly, I have been reminded through this series that “All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for training in righteousness” (2 Timothy 3:16). Even though the Old Testament was authored more than 2,000 years ago, and in many cases much longer than that, it is God’s timeless Word. As you mine its contents, you will find that it is more precious than the clearest diamonds or the finest gold that earth has to offer. My prayer is that each of us would spend time in those ancient books, and that through them, God would teach us great and marvelous truths!
