A Word from the Pastor

“SBC Summary: Part 3

Over the past two weeks, I have provided a summary of a few of the significant reports and decisions that were made at this year’s Southern Baptist Convention. Unfortunately, those positive reports on missions and theological training do not make national headlines. Instead, the national headlines that week included titles such as, “Southern Baptists Vote to Advance a Formal Ban on Churches with Women Pastors.” Perhaps you have read some of those articles. Furthermore, those articles and social media posts might have led you to have questions. My goal this morning is to provide you with an accurate summary of what took place concerning this issue and answer some of the questions you might have.

First, what exactly did the SBC vote on concerning the office of pastor? I would like to initially note that nothing was altered concerning the doctrinal stance that Southern Baptists have agreed on in our statement of faith (The Baptist Faith and Message, 2000). In Article VI of this confession, the office of pastor is defined in the following manner: “While both men and women are gifted for service in the church, the office of pastor/elder/overseer is limited to men as qualified by Scripture.” The amendment that was proposed this year, is titled the “Truth and Unity Amendment,” and was proposed by Dr. Al Mohler. The amendment states that a church “Does not act to affirm, appoint, or endorse a woman serving in the office or function of a pastor/elder/overseer, specifically preaching to the assembled congregation.” To pass, it must receive a super-majority vote of 66.6% two years in a row. At this year’s meeting, it passed with roughly 75% support.

Again, this amendment does not change anything that SBC churches have already agreed upon, per our confessional statement. It also does not have any bearing on Sunday School teachers, missionaries, or staff positions other than that of “pastor.” In fact, I am very glad to have qualified men and women serving in these roles at FBC Manning! Furthermore, I believe the SBC has failed to fully communicate and celebrate the roles that women are called to in the church. We can certainly do better in this regard! So then, what is the point? The point of the amendment is to clearly define what it means to be in friendly cooperation with the SBC, affirming that doctrinal statements do matter and are regulatory to some degree. I know that this explanation is like drinking from a fire hydrant. While I have attempted to be concise and provide a sufficient explanation, if you still have any questions about the amendment itself, please bring those questions to me.

A second question you might have is, “How did you vote, Andy?” One of the pillars of my leadership style is transparency. In that light, I will report to you that I voted in favor of this amendment. I have many friends who strongly disagree with me in this regard and yet we remain good friends. However, this is where I stand concerning this theological position, and have arrived at this conviction through many hours of struggle and questioning. While I do not have the space in this article to provide a fully sufficient explanation for my conviction, as it would take 10-20 pages to deal with the necessary passages involved, I will summarize my position. It is my position that men and women are created equal as persons but have been appointed to different roles. 1 Timothy 2-3 teaches universally that God has appointed men to serve in the office of pastor which is rooted in the order of the family at creation.

Another question you might have is, “Did the SBC overreach the local church’s authority?” In other words, does this amendment threaten the autonomy of local churches within the SBC? The answer to that question is no. This amendment does not threaten the autonomy of SBC churches. Rather, it helps to define which churches can be in the convention. This is historically how statements of faith have functioned. They function to clarify what doctrines certain churches agree upon and can be unified around. This is why the amendment is rightly titled, “Truth and Unity” instead of “Unity and Truth.” Because unity does not exist unless you are unified around something. Therefore, the amendment clarifies that those unified under the umbrella of the SBC must agree with this proposed truth.

As I have alluded throughout this article, I realize that some of our members at FBC Manning might have further questions concerning this amendment or my stance in relationship to it. My goal is not to be a pastor that sits in an ivory tower but one that is among the people he serves! My prayer is that if you desire further clarification, that you will meet with me. Even if we cannot agree on every point, my promise is to listen and to speak with transparency and honesty.
