A Word From the Pastor

"What I Didn't Have Time For"

I have a friend in ministry who once taught a Wednesday night Bible study which was comprised of points that he didn't have time for in the previous Sunday's sermon. Oftentimes, the struggle for preachers is not that they do not have enough sermon material, but that they have too much material. God's Word is so deep and rich that something in the text generally must be left out of the sermon. This has certainly been the case as we have worked through Paul's letter to the Philippians. Below, I would like to share a couple of themes that I did not have time for in this series.

First, the book of Philippians reminds believers that our faith is not a mindless endeavor. The Greek word that is often translated "to think" is used in Philippians more than any other book in the New Testament. Paul was reminding the Philippians that practicing our faith requires mental attention. Living out our faith will not happen accidentally. Christians will be faced with situations and circumstances where serious thought will be required in order to honor Christ. Amidst a culture that wants microwave answers to complex issues, believers are called to spend time in deep contemplation.

The second theme I would like to bring to your attention in Philippians is that of communal discernment. Throughout the course of life, both in the church and at home, you will encounter questions, situations, and problems that are not directly addressed in God's Word. But fear not! God has provided you with a church family to help guide you in discerning the path forward. When you are unsure how to address a problem at work, talk it over with one of your fellow church members. When you are faced with an awkward family situation and do not know how God would have you handle it, find that trusted brother or sister that will guide you through it. Whatever unknown path lies before you, God has placed you in His church as a gift. Paul encourages us in Philippians to utilize that gift.

In a couple of weeks, we will embark on our journey through the Gospel of Luke. Luke is filled with wonderful stories, timeless truths, and rich theology. In next week's article, we will lay the groundwork for our time in this wonderful story about the Son of God.
