REFLECTIONS from the lead pastor

As we enter the summer season here at Marvin Church, there are several special opportunities that await our participation: Mission Week, Vacation Bible School, and Love Thy City. Mission Week is scheduled to launch June 7 providing church members and friends many different opportunities to serve Christ in practical ways. Whether your interest is dress making, light construction repairs and painting, landscaping, organizing and sorting donations for one of our mission partners, or working at food pantries, there are a variety of service opportunities of which to avail ourselves, some indoors and some outdoors. Marvin Church, along with five other Methodist churches, will meet more than thirty needs in our community during this week of service. Our theme this year is "Who are you inviting?" with our theme verse being "Come, follow me," from Matthew 4:19. As a church, we are going to follow Jesus into Chrisitan service and trust God to do a good work.

As a part of our theme this year, I want to personally invite you to join me in serving our community. Serving the Lord is fun, and the best thing about Methodist Mission Week is that you can serve, make new Christian friendships, and go home and sleep in your own bed at night. Will you join me in being a blessing to others? Are you willing to take even one day and dedicate it to Christian service? All our cumulative service adds up to make a Kingdom impact. Are you willing to invite a friend to work alongside you? I guarantee you that your friendship will deepen and Jesus will meet you as you serve with others. You may never know the impact of what God will do through you when you show up for Christian service with God's people. God is always at work, and volunteering to serve others might give you a front row seat to see God's salvation work firsthand.

July 14-17, our church will once again host Vacation Bible School with large numbers of kids from the church and the community. Many volunteers are always needed to make this ministry endeavor successful, and last year I participated as a crew leader. Watching our children enthusiastically sing songs, listen to and engage in the gospel message, and enjoy Christian friendship and other activities, is a blessing. I hope that you will consider how you can help make this year's VBS a meaningful experience for our children. Together, we are raising up the next generation of Christ followers.

Lastly, our church will once again serve as one of the sponsoring churches for the Love Thy City event at the W.T. Brookshire Center and Rose Stadium on Saturday, July 19. As a church, we will begin praying for our city during the months of June and July asking God to bring unity to our city, revive us spiritually, and bring a

harvest of new believers. This year's one-day event will provide opportunities for service and will conclude with a large gathering in the evening for worship and preaching at Rose Stadium.



I hope that you will join us in praying for the city in your daily prayer life. Prayer guides will be available at Midweek Meditation services and at the Welcome Center.

I want to conclude this article with a story that I read in Mark Batterson's book, Wild Goose Chase. If the title seems strange, I want to remind you that to Celtic Christians, the Wild Goose is the Holy Spirit. An Geadh-Glas means "the Wild Goose." The Holy Spirit cannot be tracked or tamed and to those who pursue life under His guidance, it is always an adventure. The following story illustrates what can happen when you show up to serve in Jesus' name.

While on a mission trip with his church in Central America, a young man named Adam was riding on a bus across the countryside to catch a ferry to the airport for the mission team's return trip home. To everyone's surprise, the bus driver pulled over to pick up a middle-aged hitchhiker who looked like he had been up all night and been walking for hours.

Raul boarded the bus and took a seat next to Adam. Batterson describes Adam as one of the most caring and friendliest people that he knows. Adam was also fluent in Spanish. During conversation, Raul shared with Adam that he had tried to commit suicide the night before by drowning himself in the ocean. His wife of thirty years had left him. Adam could relate to the man's plight because he too experienced an unwanted divorce when his wife left him years before. Similarly, he, too, responded to the relationship trauma with thoughts of suicide.

How is it that these two men from different countries, but similar life experiences, could end up sitting next to each other on a bus, both sharing a common language. In the words of Pastor Mark Batterson, "Setting up divine appointments in a different hemisphere is as simple for God as setting up an appointment with your next-door neighbor."

Adam greatly encouraged Raul that day and as the two new friends parted ways, Raul said, "I felt like God

On the Ground in Ukraine: A Journey of Presence, Pain, and Hope



Just recently, Chris and Christy Hill returned from Ukraine. They reunited with seven of their Ukrainian Ministry Partners, along with seven of their children-and two small but spirited dogs. It was deeply meaningful to be together again, not just as colleagues, but as one family.

In the days leading up to our travel, we found ourselves offering reassurance:

"It's fairly safe where we'll be."

"We'll be in a calmer part of the country."

And, in many ways, that was true.

We experienced only a few air raid sirens. There were no missile strikes in our immediate vicinity. By most standards, we were safe.

But the reality in Ukraine is that war touches everything-and everyone. Even where the bombs do not fall, the burden of conflict is carried daily.

Before we even crossed the border, our Polish taxi driver shared somber news: a missile had struck Sumy that morning. Grief and vigilance are ever-present, even outside the borders of Ukraine.

One of our Ministry Partners has a husband currently serving on the front lines. He fights not only for Ukraine, but for the safety of his wife and children back home.

The lady who served as our translator and driver this trip lost her husband about a year and a half ago. He was a soldier who died defending Ukraine.

Each morning during our stay, our team members shared news from home:

- An attack in Kamianske, with missiles landing just 300 yards from their homes.
- A strike in Dnipro, where one partner's daughter learned that her classmate had been killed when a missile hit her dormitory.



We are a small organization. But this war touches all of us-both American and Ukrainian members of our team. It is not an abstract event on the news. It is personal. It is real. It is unfolding in the lives of people we love.

And yet, in the midst of such uncertainty and pain, our Ukrainian staff continues to serve. They continue to bring hope, to care for others, to be a light in what can often feel like a very dark time. Most importantly, God's Kingdom continues to grow in Ukraine.

A3 Retreat

At the beginning of May, a team from Marvin went to Japan to serve with Robert and Roberta Adair by taking care of the worship and kid's ministry for their mission agency's A3 (Asian Access) retreat. We read bible stories, sang karaoke, ate American snacks, sang worship, played in the river, played basketball, tried new foods, learn a few Japanese words, went on walks in nature and also down the street to the local 7-Eleven. The ministry of just being present with God's children is so sacred and holy. Marvin was truly blessed to get to help serve and be a part of being the hands and feet of Jesus alongside the Adair family in Japan. Thank you, Marvin Church, for your continued generosity towards missions which allows us to support heroes of the faith like the Adair's. In Japan as it is in Heaven.



We are delighted to extend a huge Tyler welcome to John Wayne as he serves as our special guest speaker on what promises to be a wonderful evening!






A Crazy Month for Marvin Students!




