

REFLECTIONS from the lead pastor

At the end of August, Gina and I had the privilege to be a of Wesleyan Studies, part of the George W. Truett Theological Seminary Wesley House of Studies Weekend hosted on the campus of Baylor University. We were there with a small delegation of Marvin members to celebrate all that God has done over the past five years through the birthing of an orthodox, evangelical, Wesleyan training institution under of Studies, and Dr. the umbrella of Baylor's Truett Seminary.

The vision for the Wesley House of Studies began in 2016, when the faculty of Truett Seminary voted unanimously to open twenty-five percent of faculty positions to orthodox, evangelical scholars outside of the Baptist tradition. The hope was to attract Wesleyan scholars in an effort to begin educating pastors for service in the Methodist tradition. In the words of Truett's Dean Todd Still, "Baptist and Methodist Churches had been serving communities together for many years, often across the street from one another."



With the "Protocol for Separation" being created after the 2019 called session of General Conference of the United Methodist Church and the talk of the emergence of a traditionalist Methodist denomination coming onto the scene, visionary leaders (in both the Methodist and Baptist camps) knew that a forthcoming denomination would need a place to educate its clergy and ministry leaders.

In the fall of 2020, Dr. Billy Abraham became the inaugural Director for the Wesley House of Studies. Dr. Abraham's selection signaled Truett's commitment to the historic Wesleyan tradition and caught the attention of many who revered Abraham as one of the brightest Wesleyan scholars in the world. That year, the Wesley House began with two students enrolled and no endowments for faculty chairs or student scholarships.

Since its inception, and the emergence of the Global Methodist Church, the Wesley House of Studies has experienced amazing growth. Even with Dr. Abraham's sudden and unexpected death in 2021, God has raised up other capable scholars like Dr. Jason Vickers, Chair

Global Methodist Church Bishop Scott Jones, Dr. Rusty Freeman, Director of the Wesley House Chappell Temple, Director of the **Pastoral Studies** Program of the GMC.

Now there are 128 students enrolled in the Wesley House and 140+ students enrolled in the Global Methodist Church's Pastoral Studies Program. Methodists now make up 25% of Truett's total enrollment. As of today, \$5.7 Million has been endowed for the work of the Wesley House with over a million dollars in scholarships awarded annually to students because of Truett's \$128 Million Endowment. I am happy to report that Marvin has the third largest Wesley House Endowment created for students being trained for ordained ministry in the Global Methodist Church. With the \$70,000 gift taken to the school during this most recent Wesley House Weekend, I am happy to report that Marvin now has an endowed scholarship totaling \$278,000. This scholarship provides a deserving Wesley House student with a \$10,000-\$12,000/ yr. scholarship. The good news is that the average seminary student at Truett benefits from having 87% of their tuition paid for by endowed scholarships. Many generous gifts are making a meaningful contribution to the future of our denomination.

The future is bright for our denomination because future pastors and leaders will continue to receive excellent education and training.

Generosity coupled with vision creates a future. As we celebrate our annual stewardship campaign this October, let us continue to seek God's direction in making Marvin's future faithful and strong. Remember the words of 2 Corinthians 8: 7 - "Since you excel in so many ways in your faith, your gifted speakers, your knowledge, your enthusiasm, and your love for us - I want you to excel also in this gracious act of giving."

Marvin Designated as an Emergency Shelter

Marvin has partnered with the American Red Cross to be an Emergency Shelter in the event of a local disaster (tornado, fire, explosion, etc.) that would create a need for sheltering local (Smith County) residents on a temporary basis. The shelter will provide food, comfort and a place to stay, along with resources to help those affected plan for their next steps.

The Red Cross will provide a team of individuals to manage the process, but we need Marvin members who are willing to partner with and assist them. If you are interested in helping serve the community after a disaster, the Red Cross will be conducting a training session for our members in an effort to be as prepared as possible for such an emergency. The training will be held on Tuesday, October 14 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m. with lunch provided. During the training, you will receive a broad overview of what to expect from a Red Cross shelter, how the shelter operates, and best practices in serving shelter clients. The local Red Cross Director has promised it will be fun and informative!
