REFLECTIONS from the executive pastor

Fanning the Flame of Discipleship: Marvin Staff with Ascending Leaders

At Marvin Methodist Church, discipleship is not just one ministry among many—it is the heart of everything we do. To help strengthen and deepen this culture, our entire staff recently participated in a **Discipleship Workshop** with *Ascending Leaders*, a ministry devoted to equipping churches to live out the Great Commission.

Why This Workshop?

Marvin has been intentionally shaping a Discipleship Pathway that helps every person move forward in their walk with Christ—from Exploring Christ to Christ—Centered living. For new staff, this workshop served as an introduction to the language and vision we share. For long-tenured staff, it was a much-needed refresher that reminded us of the "why" behind our ministries.

As one staff member reflected afterward:

"It's easy to get caught up in tasks. This time with Ascending Leaders pulled me back to the bigger picture—helping people encounter Jesus and take their next step with Him."

Setting the Culture

The workshop reinforced what we are striving to embed in every program and relationship: a clear, consistent pathway of discipleship. "Instead of simply asking, 'What do we offer?' the more important question becomes, 'How does this help someone take their next step with Christ?""

The pathway reminds us:

- In the Exploring Christ stage, we invite people to come and see Jesus through worship, friendship, and safe spaces to ask questions.
- In Growing in Christ, we encourage practices like Life-to-Life mentoring and small groups called Class Meetings where transformation is experienced in the context of relationship.
- As people become Close to Christ, the journey becomes deeply personal—prioritizing being with God and doing for God, sharing stories, and serving in ways that stretch faith. Deeper spiritual disciplines and micro groups called Band Meetings are outlets for pursuing Christlikeness in community.
- The goal is to live Christ-Centered lives—fully surrendered, sacrificial, and abiding in Jesus, bearing fruit for His kingdom.

"We don't want to just run good programs—that merely makes people's lives busier. We want to form disciples who look like Jesus. This workshop fanned that flame amongst our team."






STUDENTS
