Nahum: The Prophet Who Makes You Say "Hmm"

## I. A Forgotten Prophet with a Familiar Message

- A. Set the stage:
  - 1. 150 years after Jonah.
  - 2. Nineveh has returned to its oppressive and wicked ways.
  - 3. God's patience has run out judgment is coming.
- B. Nahum delivers a message of justice to Nineveh and comfort to Judah.

#### II. Clouds, Feet, and Hope

- Nahum 1:3

"The Lord is slow to anger but great in power; the Lord will not leave the guilty unpunished. His way is in the whirlwind and the storm, and clouds are the dust of his feet."

- A. Big Idea 1: God is Present in the Clouds
  - 1. Life with Jesus often starts bright and full of joy but there will come clouds
  - 2. What if Clouds aren't a sign of God's absence but evidence of His presence?
    - "The clouds are the dust of His feet."
    - Revelation 1:7 He comes with the clouds.
- B. Without clouds, there's no rain.
  - 1. No growth.
  - 2. No deepening of faith.
  - 3. No refining of character.
- "God uses clouds not just to teach, but to un-teach—to simplify our faith to childlike trust" - Ozwald Chambers

#### III. A Fortress in the Storm

- Nahum 1:7

"The Lord is good, a refuge in times of trouble. He cares for those who trust in Him."

- A. Big Idea 2: The Lord is Good
  - 1. Hebrew word: "Tov" more than just "nice" or "not bad."
    - Rich, beautiful, bountiful, full of blessing.
- B. He is a refuge a stronghold.
  - 1. A rock, a fortress, a safe place in the storm.

- C. Faith in the storm reveals His character:
  - 1. We learn His goodness as we are unlearning the habits of self-reliance.
  - 2. We experience Him as both refuge and redeemer.
- Jesus is not just our protector He's also the one who steps out and fights for us.

# IV. Shackles Broken, Victory Won

- Nahum 1:13

"Now I will break their yoke from your neck and tear your shackles away."

- A. Big Idea 3: Jesus Has Broken the Yoke
  - 1. Luke 4:18-19 Jesus declares Himself the fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy.
    - Good news.
    - Freedom for captives.
    - Release for the oppressed.
- B. Ephesians 6:12 Our real battle is spiritual.
- C. Jesus breaks the chains of sin and death.
  - 1. Not just protection, but liberation.
  - 2. Not just safety, but victory.

### V. Fix Your Eyes and Celebrate

- Text: Nahum 1:15

"Look, there on the mountains, the feet of one who brings good news, who proclaims peace! Celebrate your festivals, Judah, and fulfill your vows..."

- A. Big Idea 4: We See and Celebrate
  - "Look" Behold, fix your eyes on the one who brings the good news Jesus.
    - What we fix our eyes on, we become.
    - Are you beholding Him?
- B. "Celebrate" Worship, remembrance, gratitude.
  - 1. Worship is a declaration of trust and remembrance of God's faithfulness.
- C. Luke 7:36-50 A sinful woman worships Jesus with tears and perfume.
  - 1. The one forgiven much loves much.
  - 2. Our celebration flows from knowing we've been rescued.

### VI. From Storm to Song

- A. Nahum isn't just a message of judgment it's a message of hope for the hurting, freedom for the captive, and peace for the soul.
- B. Jesus is:
  - 1. The one in the clouds
  - 2. The refuge in the storm
  - 3. The breaker of chains

# 4. The bringer of peace

## **Questions for Further Reflection:**

- 1. Where have the clouds rolled in recently in your life and how might they be evidence of God's presence, not His absence?
- -Reflect on how difficulty may be drawing you deeper into dependence and relationship with Jesus.
- 2. What do you tend to run to for refuge when life gets hard and how can you intentionally run to the Lord instead?
  - -Consider how you can make God your first, not last, place of peace and safety.
- 3. Are there any "shackles" you're still carrying that Jesus has already broken? What would it look like to live as someone who is truly free?
- 4. What are you currently beholding and is it shaping you more into the image of Jesus or something else?
- -"We become what we behold." What practical step can you take this week to fix your eyes on Him?
