David Ansari, Bangladesh - Rohingya women are learning Bible lessons. Many of them are accepting Jesus as their personal Savior, please pray for those so we can nurture them. Mission India - Two weeks ago, in the state of Manipur, India, a group of church leaders were traveling back from an interchurch conference when they were ambushed. Three prominent church leaders were killed. At least five have been hospitalized. Manipur has been in a state of ethnic and religious violence for over three years. Hundreds of lives have been claimed. But the Church in Manipur isn't going anywhere. In fact, it's been pressing into that pain: the very conference these church leaders were just leaving was put together to discuss peace-making opportunities between Manipur's warring communities. In a public statement, a prominent Christian leader in Manipur requested that "churches across India remember Manipur in their upcoming worship services, prayer meetings, and gatherings, asking God for comfort, healing, peace, and wisdom."
