IT ALL STARTS WITH **M.O.R.E.**

Foundry gathers every week in the wealthiest zip code in the Metro area. In our community, many people have all kinds of MORE - homes, vehicles, toys, wealth, and all the trappings of worldly "success". However, more and more achievements and possessions don't create lasting joy.

King Solomon also poured his life into the wrong kind of MORE. After pursuing and obtaining every possible human desire, he said "...yet when I surveyed all that my hands had done and what I had toiled to achieve, everything was meaningless, a **chasing after the wind**; nothing was gained under the sun..." (Ecclesiastes 2:11).

Like Solomon, what most people in our community are missing is Jesus. Jesus tells us that our desire for an abundant life is only **realized in Him**, saying "...I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full..." (John 10:10). He teaches and models a radically different set of priorities and pursuits.

At Foundry - we summarize these priorities with the acronym **M.O.R.E.**

A VISION NOT A BUILDING

Foundry has been a mobile church since 2018. Our volunteers have set up and torn down for over 250 events. All that work can lead us to hastily conclude that a building is our vision. But we want MORE than walls and a roof.

The sad reality is that many church buildings sit unused Monday through Saturday, locked up after the excitement of services, kids ministry, and fellowship in the lobby. They remain once-a-week edifices for people naturally drawn to the spiritual training offered during worship services.

We envision something bigger: A BUILDING FILLED WITH MINISTRY ALL WEEK

Our building will be alive seven days a week with the sounds of kids and teachers. Love will flow from our building 365 days a year.

REACH FAMILIES THROUGH QUALITY CHILD CARE


People are reached when churches fulfill a need.

Few of our neighbors are clamoring to sign up for small groups or attend worship services. Instead, they ask if local churches offer something that addresses a real need.

But what do the families of Douglas County need?

While some people are always in financial need, the majority of those living around us don't need soup kitchens or gently used clothes. The families of Douglas County need quality child care.

Castle Pines only has enough licensed daycare facilities for 6% of local need




WHY CHILD CARE?

Reaching MORE children is the key strategy for advancing the gospel. The child care industry represents a shining opportunity in both family need and gospel opportunity. The number of full-time working couples is at an all-time high and will only continue to grow. Families are clamoring for excellent child care solutions.

Research shows that unless we reach a person for Christ by the age of 13, chances are slim that we ever will. Statistically speaking, **the first seven years of a person's life are the most important for spiritual development.** A person's basic worldview and moral framework is largely formed by age nine.

Further, **unreached adults are most receptive to church when they start having children.** Providing high-quality, affordable child care is the ideal strategy to reach more children and parents with the good news of Jesus during these most spiritually receptive years.

An amazing **58%** of all three to five-year-old children in America are enrolled in a child care program. **17%** of grade-school children are in an after-school program, and another **41%** would be if one was available.

WHAT IS LIONHEART?

Lionheart Children’s Academy is a Christian non-profit that teams up with churches to launch and operate academies in existing church facilities – offering full-time preschool, after school, and summer programs from birth to 12 years of age.

Lionheart runs the academies - providing operational and educational excellence on par with the best secular providers. This frees up our church body to focus on discipleship, evangelism, and outreach, rather than the confusing grind of managing a daycare program.



Provides all daycare operations, compliance with daycare regulations, HR and payroll, security, shared revenue





A FUTURE FOR **MORE**

Phase 2 will be built approximately three years after Phase 1. It will be funded by Foundry growth and significant shared revenue from Lionheart Academy. This future development adds 20,000 square feet for an enlarged sanctuary, lobby, youth space, and offices.

WHAT IS THE BUILDING FOR M.O.R.E. CAMPAIGN

Building for MORE is a two year capital campaign with a goal of raising \$1.6 Million over-and-above our regular tithes and offerings. This goal represents twice the amount of typical giving over a 24 month period. This will allow us to pay off the land, donate to a missions building project, and fund the downpayment of Phase 1 all while continuing our regular church operations and expenses.

Radical Generosity

- **PRAY:** ask God to stretch your faith and stir generosity in your heart. Ask God to show you what He wants you to give towards Building For MORE
- **CONSIDER:** read through the Generosity material below and let it stretch you
- **COMMIT:** fill out and turn in your commitment card on March 10

Engaged Fully in Family

- **SPIRITUAL TALK:** take time to share what God is teaching you with someone in your family
 - If you're married, go out together. Make a date night out of it
 - If you have kids, set up a special dinner party and discuss
 - If you have siblings, grab lunch together or set up a phone call



THE POWER OF RADICAL GENEROSITY

For us to reach our **Building for MORE Campaign** goal of \$1.6M in two years, it will require all of us to grow in living out our core value of **Radical Generosity**.

Radical Generosity is Spirit Inspired

As you approach your commitment to God through the Building For MORE Campaign, begin with prayer. Thank God for all the blessings in your life and then **ask God for guidance and discernment** as to how to steward those blessings.

2 Samuel 24:24, "I will not sacrifice to the Lord my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing."

Radical Generosity is Planned

A commitment decision requires careful thought and time. It requires that you make plans, set goals, and evaluate how your sacrifice **reorients your desires and serves as a means to glorify God**.

Radical Generosity is Sacrificial

Your commitment to the capital campaign is a gift over and above your annual giving to Foundry. It may require **changing** how you spend your money, postponing purchases or doing without something. Each of us has different means and resources, but **we can all share proportionately in this sacrifice**. May we have the heart of King David expressed in

An Act of Worship

Your financial commitment is a way to say **"thanks be to God!"** We acknowledge that everything we have is a blessing from God, and we joyfully return a portion to Him.

CREATIVE WAYS TO GROW IN RADICAL GENEROSITY



Practice Priority Budgeting

Many families will rearrange their priorities and give up something in their current budget to give more to the Building For MORE Campaign. For example, priority budgeting may mean **postposing a planned expenditure** such as a new car, vacation, home remodeling project or other major purchase.

Redirect Present Expenditures

Often, families have significant short-term expenditures for special needs. One example is the cash flow **freed up** when a loan term ends. Another example is a child graduating from college during the next couple of years, which would allow them to increase their commitment by giving what they **had previously been spending** on tuition.

Increased Giving With Increased Income

Some people receive periodic increases in salary or bonuses. Many of us are tempted to increase our lifestyle to fit the higher income. In many instances, families will decide to **commit the full amount of salary increases** toward Kingdom impact.

Give From your Excess

Some individuals may have valuable collectibles, inheritance, savings, or other resources that could be donated to the Building For MORE Campaign.

Commit Unexpected Cash

People often pray for God to show them a way to give beyond what they can presently see or afford. Sometimes, the answers come unexpectedly.

Sacrifice Your Extra Time

Some have extra time and are willing to volunteer in various ministries. Others choose to get a part-time job to be able to give more to the church. This is particularly true for families whose children are grown and away from home and for semi-retired couples.

Donate Appreciated Assets

Many people own stocks worth significantly more than the original purchase price. That is good news. The bad news is that if these stocks are sold, a significant portion of the gain would be lost to taxation. **Gifting an appreciated asset, typically investment securities or real estate, can be highly advantageous to both the donor and the church.** By transferring ownership of the asset to the church, the donor avoids capital gains taxes on the asset's sale. In addition, the donor receives an income tax charitable deduction for the asset's full market value. That, in effect, makes these gifts less costly to make. (Remember to consult your CPA, tax attorney, or other financial advisors before committing this type of gift.)

Lastly...

Giving does not have to be in equal increments over the Building For MORE Campaign. **You might be able to give more in the second year than in the first.** As you think about your financial commitment to Building For MORE, consider not just your current potential to give right now, but also your future potential. It might be that you can make a two-year commitment in which 35-40% is given in the first year and 60-65% is given in the second year.



LIVING M.O.R.E.

Your generosity makes an impact! Every dollar you give to Foundry expands the mission of the gospel, impacts our local community, brings hope to people across the globe, and transforms YOU in the process!

A relationship with Jesus will *always* transform YOU and *giving* helps this by:

strengthening your devotion to Jesus and **freeing you** to live open-handed with God's gifts

actively acknowledging that **everything** you have is a blessing from God

building trust in God and **His provision** instead of perceived self-sufficiency

living in active worship as you **joyfully return** a portion to the Lord

GENEROSITY JOURNEY

We are all at different places in our generosity journey, and we value each person taking the next step as a disciple of Jesus. Where are you now, and what is your next step?

Legacy Giver


I give a sacrificial percentage of my income as an offering to Foundry, but I want to give beyond that to make a Kingdom impact that will outlive me.

MY STEP: Consider assets I own that can be leveraged to support Foundry's Kingdom work.

Sacrificial Giver

I have been giving my tithe of 10% regularly, but now I am going to add an offering that increases my giving percentage over and above the tithe.

MY STEP: Determine the new percentage I want to give and calculate that amount based on my income.



1st Time Giver

I have never given to Foundry. Today I am starting my generosity journey.

MY STEP: Give a gift of any amount to Foundry for the first time.

Consistent Giver

I have given to Foundry occasionally, but today I will begin tithing regularly.

MY STEP: Determine how much my regular tithe will be (10% of my income) and when I will give it.


