

**Ephesians – Our Walk with Christ**  
**“Our Walk in Relationships”**  
**Ephesians 6:21-24**  
**August 24, 2025**  
**Devotionals**

## **Day 1 – The Gift of Encouragement**

**Key Verse:** *“So that you also may know how I am and what I am doing, Tychicus the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything.” (v21)*

**Reflection:** Paul wasn’t afraid to share his life with the church. He wanted believers to know his situation, not to boast, but to encourage them. Tychicus was sent as a living letter—his presence and report would lift their hearts.

**Application:** Who could you encourage this week by sharing how God has been at work in your life? Encouragement isn’t about pretending things are perfect—it’s about reminding others that Christ is faithful in every circumstance.

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## **Day 2 – Faithful Messengers**

**Key Verse:** *“I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may encourage your hearts.” (v22)*

**Reflection:** Tychicus wasn’t just a courier—he was a minister of encouragement. Paul recognized that people needed more than doctrine; they needed to see faith embodied in real people.

**Application:** God often uses ordinary believers as “messengers” of encouragement. Who has been a Tychicus in your life? How might you be that person for someone else today?

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## **Day 3 – Peace from Christ**

**Key Verse:** *“Peace be to the brothers, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.” (v23)*

**Reflection:** Paul closes with a blessing of peace. True peace is not found in the absence of problems but in the presence of Christ. Notice how peace, love, and faith are gifts “from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.” They flow from Him, not from within us.

**Application:** Where do you most need Christ’s peace right now? Pray specifically for His peace to guard your heart and mind.

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## Day 4 – Grace with Love

**Key Verse:** *“Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible.” (v24)*

**Reflection:** Paul ends with grace—the same way he began the letter (Eph. 1:2). The Christian life is framed by God’s grace, sustained by His grace, and finished by His grace. This grace is for those who love Christ with a love that does not fade, a love rooted in His eternal love for us.

**Application:** Is your love for Christ vibrant, or has it grown cold? Ask God to rekindle in you a “love incorruptible”—a love anchored in His unchanging grace.

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## Day 5 – The Power of Closing Words

**Key Verse:** *So that you also may know how I am and what I am doing, Tychicus the beloved brother and faithful minister in the Lord will tell you everything. I have sent him to you for this very purpose, that you may know how we are, and that he may encourage your hearts. Peace be to the brothers, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible. (v21-24)*

**Reflection:** Paul’s closing isn’t just a polite farewell—it is pastoral, relational, and deeply spiritual. He points us to encouragement in community (Tychicus), to peace from Christ, and to grace that sustains us. His last words remind us that the Christian life is never lived alone and never apart from God’s gifts.

**Application:** How do your closing words—texts, emails, conversations—leave others? Do they build up, bring peace, and extend grace? This week, make your closing words a blessing that reflects Christ’s love.
