



## SERMON OUTLINE NOTES

### I. PETER EXHORTS ELDERS TO SHEPHERD THE CHURCH (1 PETER 5:1-3)

A. Peter identifies himself as an Elder, exhorting Elders **(1 Peter 5:1; 1 Peter 1:1)**

1. Like Peter, local church Elders have delegated authority and are undershepherds of the Chief Shepherd **(1 Peter 2:25; 5:4; John 21:15-17)**

2. Local churches should have Elders **(Acts 14:23; Titus 1:5-11, 13; Philippians 1:1)**

B. Peter's exhortation is for Elders to shepherd the church exercising oversight **(1 Peter 5:2; 1 Timothy 5:17)**

1. An overseer, elder, or pastor are interchangeable, which means authority and caring form the concept of what it means to shepherd **(Matthew 2:6; 1 Peter 2:25; Acts 20:17, 28; 1 Timothy 3:4-5)**

2. To Shepherd well, the Elders must know the flock **(John 10:17, 27)**, they must feed the flock **(John 21:15, 17; 1 Timothy 3:2-3; Titus 1:9; Ephesians 4:11-14)**, they must lead the flock **(John 10:27; Hebrews 13:7, 17)**, they must protect the flock **(John 10:10-14; Acts 20:29; Titus 1:9-11)**

C. The manner of shepherding is to be willing, eager, and an example **(1 Peter 5:2-3)**

1. Elders should be willing and eager to shepherd **(1 Peter 5:2; 1 Timothy 3:1; John 10:12-13)**

2. Elders should be examples to the flock **(1 Peter 5:3; 1 Corinthians 11:1; Matthew 23:1-7; Romans 2:17-23)**

### II. WHEN JESUS, THE CHIEF SHEPHERD APPEARS, FAITHFUL ELDERS WILL BE CROWNED WITH GLORY (1 PETER 5:4)

A. Faithful Elders help faithful Christians prepare for glory **(Philippians 1:25-26; 2 Corinthians 1:24; 2 Timothy 2:10; 1 Peter 1:5, 7; 4:13)**

B. Faithful Elders will receive a crown of glory for their work **(1 Peter 5:4, 1; 1 Corinthians 3:7-14)**

## 1 PETER 5:1-4

*So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed:<sup>2</sup> shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly;<sup>3</sup> not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock.<sup>4</sup> And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory.*
