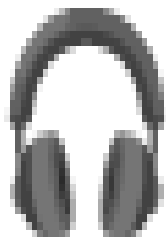

CHILDREN'S CHURCH RETURNS - A JOYFUL NEW CHAPTER

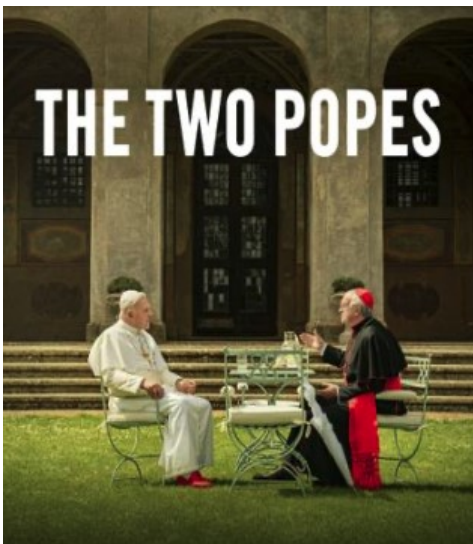
On **Kickoff Sunday, September 7th**, we launch our newly-structured **Children's Church**—a place where kids can grow in faith, have fun, and experience God's Word in ways that connect with their hearts and minds.

During the 10:00 a.m. service, children will gather in the nursery space for a time tailored just for them. Our youngest participants (**12 months – 4 years**) will enjoy gentle play and simple activities. Our older children (**Kindergarten – 5th grade**) will dive into the same Bible readings we hear in worship—exploring them through crafts, games, drama, and other creative activities.

It's a **combined group**, so “in-between” ages can join the parts that interest them most. Two volunteers will be with the children each week, ensuring a safe, caring, and engaging environment.

After Children's Church, the kids will rejoin their families in the church for Communion

We can't wait to share this new adventure with our kids and their families. So bring your children, bring your joy, and let's grow together!

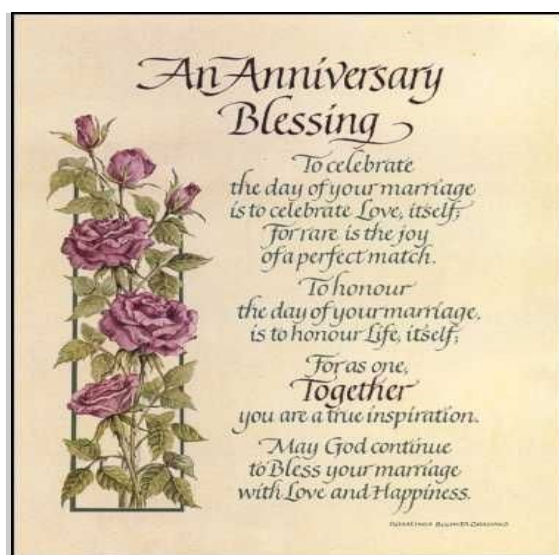
A Wish and a Prayer
