Reflections from the Rector:

At our recent annual Diocesan Clergy Conference, I was reminded of the deep gift it is simply to stop and praise God. The days were filled not so much with meetings or lectures, but with prayer, singing, reflection, and fellowship. There was space to be renewed. I found myself returning to the familiar words many of us learned early in our childhoods which we sing each Sunday:

Praise God from whom all blessings flow...

Those words remind us that everything we have - our homes, our relationships, our gifts and talents, even the breath that fills our lungs - is a blessing from God. When we pause to recognize that truth, we begin to see the world differently. We loosen our grip on what we fear we may lose and step more fully into the abundant life God offers. Praise shifts our mindset from scarcity to gratitude, from worry to trust.

As Christians, we are also storytellers of this abundance. Our faith is rooted in the great story God has told across generations: from the creation of the world, through the voices of the prophets, to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Yet that story did not end at the empty tomb. It continues in us - here, now. Like Mary, the mother of Jesus, who proclaimed, "Tell out my soul, the greatness of the Lord!" or Mary Magdalene who ran from the tomb to share the Good News, we too are bearers of God's story.

This is why stewardship is not simply about fundraising or budgets - it is about telling the story of God's love with our lives. When we give, we are saying with our actions what we believe in our hearts: that God has given us more than enough, that we trust God to continue providing, and that we want to participate in God's ongoing work of hope, healing, and transformation.

So this month, as you consider your stewardship pledge, I invite you to do so prayerfully. Ask yourself: What is the Good News that God is writing in my life? What blessings have I received that I am called to share? How is God inviting me to "tell out my soul" in love, service, and generosity?

May we, together, praise God with grateful hearts and continue the story God is telling through us at St. Bart's.


Come and See. We will walk this path together.....sharing our experiences along the way.

What a wonderful Pumpkin Patch season! We are deeply grateful for every volunteer who helped unload pumpkins, worked shifts, read stories to preschoolers, and welcomed our neighbors with warmth and joy.

This year's pumpkin sales raised approximately \$3,000! This year's patch, though, was more than a fundraiser - it was truly a ministry. We made meaningful connections with our community, hosted a free Pumpkin - Palooza party for families, and shared laughter, friendship, and the beauty of fall together.



Every dollar raised will go directly to help those in need right here in our community. Thank you for your generosity, your energy, and your love in action. St. Bart's shines brightly because of you!

Endowment Campaign Update: Let's Keep Growing!

This spring, we relaunched the St. Bartholomew's Endowment Fund—a commitment to care not only for our church today, but for those who will worship, learn, and be formed here for generations to come. We are delighted to share that your generosity continues to grow this effort in meaningful ways.

As of November, we have received \$34,050 in gifts from the parish. Because of the anonymous matching challenge, every dollar given has been doubled, bringing our current total to \$68,100 toward our \$200,000 goal. Thank you to everyone who has already contributed—you are helping plant something that will last.

Our original timeline invited gifts by December 31, and we continue to encourage and welcome year-end giving. At the same time, several parishioners have expressed that—for tax or financial planning reasons—they are best able to give early in the new year. In response, the matching opportunity will **remain available into early 2025**, ensuring that these gifts are also doubled.

What does this mean?

- ♦ If you are able to give this year, your gift will make an immediate impact, and we are deeply grateful.
- ♦ If you need to give after January 1 for tax purposes, the matching funds will still be there for you.

Endowment giving is distinct from our annual pledges: these gifts are invested for the long-term, helping us care for our buildings, support new ministries, and say "yes" to opportunities the Spirit places before us.

You can give by check with "Endowment" in the memo line, or contact the office to discuss giving appreciated stock or including St. Bartholomew's in your estate plans.

Thank you for your faithfulness, your generosity, and your hope for the future of this church we love.
