In putting this guide together, the foundational question we have asked is: "What does the Bible say and teach about baptism?" Therefore, we've included the text of many of the Scriptures about baptism for you. Other Scriptures are simply referenced by book, chapter, and verse. To receive the most from your study, we encourage you to read each passage cited.

One question you may have up front is this, "When I'm ready for baptism, what is my next step?" Our process for guiding a person to the moment of their baptism has been designed to be both simple and meaningful.
