I wrestled in both junior high and high school.

However, I wasn't very good at it. I didn't have the strength or the instincts to do very well and I certainly didn't enjoy myself. Every day I would be sick to my stomach dreading going to practice after school. I was miserable. So why was I wrestling? Because I loved **football** and our defensive line coach was the head wrestling coach. I had heard that if you wanted a starting spot on the football team, then you had better be a wrestler . . . so that's what I did.

However, before the season started in my junior year, I was given the opportunity to play string bass in a large high school symphony on the weekends. That would mean that I would miss most of the wrestling tournaments. I didn't want to stop wrestling because I wanted the best chance to play on the defensive line in football, but I cared **more** about improving at music. Therefore, the decision was pretty easy. I didn't go out for wrestling anymore and I started practicing my bass a lot more and, eventually, went on to receive my Masters degree in Double Bass Performance at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music.

Imagine if I had kept on being a bad wrestler to impress my coach instead of changing my focus to follow what God had placed as a passion in my heart? A lot of things might have changed in my life and not for the better. I sometimes think about this experience when I am looking at the things we do as a church as well. I like to ask the question: Who are we doing this for? Because once we focus on our mission as a church, it will be much easier to know when to stop certain activities and when to start others.

In a recent sermon, I asked the question about why we come to church. Do you come to church because **God** needs you to? Well, that sounds very nice and religious, but God actually doesn't **need** you to worship Him. So then, is the church here to fulfill **your** needs? I mean, that sounds good too, but if we start thinking like that then church becomes just like any other product that we consume in our society. We can start becoming so focused on what makes **us** happy that we start to think of church like Burger King—we want everything at church to be **our** way.

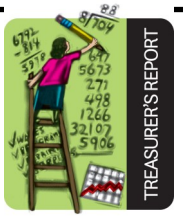

Treasurer's Report



- 1) **May 2026**
Our Operating Checking Account decreased \$2008 to \$28,060 in May. \$12,518 of Benevolence Liabilities due as of May 31.
- 2) We continue to be debt free.
- 3) Offerings of \$45,493 in May with 2026 year-to-date total of \$208,324. This year-to-date total compares favorably to 2025 total of \$188,031, 2024 total of \$195,899, and 2023 total of \$203,275.
- 4) May operating expenses of \$45,534 as compared to budget of \$49,830. We paid our final \$4000 installment of our \$12,000 contract to Unstuck group company in May. In addition, we paid our final installment of \$39,331 of our \$157,324 contract to the Elevator company.
- 5) Continued good news on Endowment fund as we had a \$12,651 investment gain in May. 2026 Year to date gain is now \$50,716.

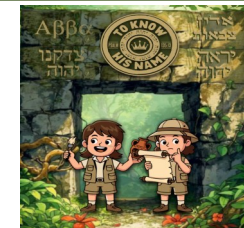
