

One of my jobs at home is vacuuming. It's not a bad job and I enjoy the sound of all the dirt being sucked up. Our vacuum even has a see through container where you get to see all of the dirt—and especially hair!—that is going to get thrown away. And yet the job is also pretty

frustrating because I am **always** trying to go farther than the cord will allow. All of a sudden, I lose power, and I have to go back and plug the thing back in. Electricity is a pretty magical thing and there are lots of appliances, gadgets and power tools that use it, but you **must** stay connected or else you won't be able to finish the job you started.

The same is true with our relationship to God. We **must** stay connected to Him or else we will lose the power that He promises. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth." – Acts 1:8 How can we stay connected to the power that God offers to us? I believe that one of the best ways is through prayer.

I **love** my weekly prayer time on Thursday mornings. For almost two decades, I have tried to make time each week to pray for at least an hour and not only ask for things and seek guidance from God but **listen** to what **He** has to tell me. Recently, when I was praying, I was telling God how much I loved that time with Him and He told me, "You know. I am available **all** of the time. . . not just Thursday mornings." He seemed to be saying that I could be praying **a lot** more than I was. If I was so encouraged and inspired and helped by this prayer time, why wasn't I praying more **throughout** the week?

This point was made even more clearly when I was praying on another day. I was feeling overwhelmed by everything that had to be done and I was feeling very tired as well. I felt like God spoke to me again and said, "Stop working out of your **own** strength and look to **Me** for strength." Two Bible verses popped into my head, "Come to Me all you who are weary and heavy burdened and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28) and "For when I am weak, then I am strong." (2<sup>nd</sup> Corinthians 12:10) I realized that if I was truly following God's will for my life, then **He** was more interested in me completing the work than I

was. So, instead of trying to get everything done by myself, why wasn't I praying for God's strength to help me get everything done?

When we try to do all of our work without staying connected to God, we are about as successful as that vacuum cleaner trying to work without being plugged in. Our source of power is lost. The only real difference is that when you pray for God to fill you with **His** power and strength your life has a much better chance of **not** sucking as much!

Take time to pray. Every day. Most importantly, don't try to do your work without making sure that you are connected to the source of your life and power—God! Amen.

### Treasurer's Report

September 2025

1. Our Operating checking account decreased \$703 to \$13,781 in September. All Benevolences and Payroll tax liabilities were paid current as of quarter end.



- 2. We continue to be debt free.
- 3. Continued good news on Offerings as September offerings came in at \$47,216. Year to date offerings for 2025 total \$369,000 as compared to \$348,000 last year, \$357,000 in 2023, \$318,000 in 2022, and \$358,000 in 2021.
- 4. September operating expenses of \$43,459 as compared to budget of \$45,581. We are now \$26,000 under our operating expense budget for 2025.
- 5. Endowment funds total \$661,000 after a September investment gain of \$9729. The overall investment gain for 2025 is now \$63,755.
- 6. Estate gifts under investment total \$434,000. Interest earnings year to date on these gifts total \$15,908. We will need to pay approximately \$86,000 from these funds when the elevator work is completed.



Thanks to everyone who has signed up for an account with Rightnow Media! Next, I want to encourage you to **use** it! In order to make that happen, I thought that I would give you all a few suggestions on some videos that I believe are really good. Some of these are meant to be

used for personal devotions while others would work best in a small group. You can also find them in the St. John's Lutheran Church Custom Library under "Pastor Steven's Picks" when you login to your RightNow Media account.

### 1. The Lord's Prayer - Laurie Short

Many of us have memorized the Lord's prayer. But what do the words mean? If this is the only prayer Jesus taught his followers to pray, it's worth knowing what it is we are praying! In this 6 session study, Laurie Short will take you line by line through this prayer, to discover the meaning and power of each word. You'll never pray this prayer the same again!

### 2. The Prayer Course II: Unanswered Prayer - Pete Greig

The Prayer Course II: Unanswered Prayer is a five-week small group resource from 24-7 Prayer; a follow up to The Prayer Course, which reached over 3 million people in its first year. In the midst of a global pandemic, the Prayer Course II: Unanswered Prayer is an opportunity for groups to process pain and disappointment; to ask truthful and significant questions of faith; and to unite in the face of uncertainty towards healing and hope. Join 24-7 founder Pete Greig and BAFTA award-winning TV presenter Gemma Hunt as they journey through the final days of Jesus, asking some of the hardest and most personal questions we face as Christians, such as "How am I going to get through this?", "Why aren't my prayers being answered?" and "Where is God when heaven is silent?" Each of the five sessions will also feature an exclusive interview with a special guest: pastor and author Bob Sorge, broadcaster Simon Thomas, activist and Church planter Ladan Nouri, Gospel singer Helen Berhane, and 24-7 Prayer Ireland's former National leader Alain Emerson. The Prayer Course II: Unanswered Prayer draws on themes from Pete Greig's book, God on Mute and has been designed to be run alongside the book.

### 3. Shepherding Your Adult Children - Holly Culhane

Loving and shepherding your fully launched adult kids requires a nuanced understanding of your role as parent. Join author and speaker Holly Culhane as she guides parents of independent children through God's words to the shepherds of old to help you lead well the grown kids in your life. This highly interactive seven-session experience for small groups explores the biblical framework of shepherd leadership, the three biblically based key elements of shepherding your adult children well, and practical action steps to help you enjoy genuine connections and healthier relationships with your established adult kids.

I hope that you will take advantage of these videos and the over 25,000 other videos on all kinds of spiritual topics. They can really help you grow in your faith! – Pastor Broers

### REMEMBERING THE SAINTS

When Paul wrote to the church in Rome, he addressed his letter "To all God's beloved ... who are called to be saints" (Romans 1:7,

NRSV). Paul regarded his fellow believers as people who have responded to the good news of Christ by choosing to follow and serve God.

The New Testament emphasizes that Christians are God's beloved special people set apart to receive his grace and to be his witnesses. All people whose minds and hearts are devoted to God are "called to be saints."

About 700 years after the church began, leaders designated November 1 as All Saints' Day to honor people whose lives reflect Christ dwelling within them. Because of what God has done for us, all Christians can wear the label of saint.

It was a time for celebration as 780 people gathered October 5-8 at Hosanna Church in Lakeville, MN for Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ's 25th Annual Gathering & Convention and a celebration of the association's silver anniversary.

"Our Help and Hope" was the theme of this year's program, which was based on the hymn O God, Our Help in Ages Past, as well as 1 Corinthians 3:10-13.

### HIGHLIGHTS

Throughout the four-day experience, participants had the opportunity to hear from speakers, explore areas of interest at breakout sessions, connect with others in the LCMC community through meet and greets and fellowship opportunities, join together in both contemporary and traditional worship, and get to know mission, ministry, and educational organizations in our exhibitor area.

   Matters—Delegates approved an article and bylaws clarifying financial and legal procedures for the NALC.


