

As I am writing this article for the newsletter, we have just completed a week of Vacation Bible School. I am simultaneously exhilarated and exhausted. It was a great week! We averaged 57 students each day (preschool-5th grade) with our biggest day being 64 students. It was an awesome opportunity to impact families with the love of

Jesus! And one of the highlights of the week was seeing the generosity of our youth as they raised \$522.15 for Lutheran World Relief and helped make four quilts and lots of bandages that will go toward Missions. I feel like our VBS kids had a really fun time growing in their knowledge of God this last week but that they also grew in their ability to serve, others which was an awesome thing to see!

These numbers were a tremendous success, but they were not the **most** exciting thing that I saw this week! A week ago, I was listening to a speaker talk about the differences between healthy, growing churches and unhealthy, declining churches. The speaker said that their research showed that one of the signs of a healthy, growing church was that there was a high level of volunteerism. At declining churches, the staff did most of the work of ministry, but at growing churches the work of ministry was done primarily by volunteers.

This week at Vacation Bible School, people of all ages were taking part in every aspect of what was happening. Grandmas and grandpas, high school and confirmation students as well as moms and college students were all part of the team and it wouldn't have been the same without every single one of them. Not only do I want to thank all of you who were here to volunteer for VBS, but I also want you as a congregation to recognize how special it is to be a part of a church that has such commitment from its members. I believe that this showed the kids who came to St. John's for the week a great example of how we don't just talk about Jesus in this church, but we are following His call to love and serve others in a real way.

Ephesians 4 says, "So Christ Himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." As a pastor, I **love** feeling like I am a part of a **team** of people, all striving for the same goal: to share the love of Jesus with people who need to hear about Him.

And that's how it felt this last week. My role here at St. John's is to encourage, equip and empower **you** as followers of Jesus to live out your callings and experience the power of the Holy Spirit in service to others. That is what I saw happening at Vacation Bible School.

I know that not everyone was able to help this past week due to various conflicts, including vacations and work schedules. Thankfully, as part of a congregation of people, we all have different gifts and opportunities to serve. In the coming months, you are going to have more chances to volunteer at St. John's and I hope that you prayerfully consider stepping out in faith and making an impact on the lives of the people in this community.

For example, starting in the Fall, we will be focusing on small groups again and we will be looking for people who are willing to lead those groups. It's a great opportunity to grow closer in relationship with God and one another. If you feel like God might be calling you to lead a group, please talk to me. In addition, starting Wednesday, September 10th, we are starting a new youth program called GROW that will serve families with preschool-5th graders. We are looking for people who can read the Bible stories for each class and guide them by asking the night's questions, helpers for each class as well as kitchen workers for nightly food and greeters to help with registration. If you can help for a couple hours once a week or even a couple times each month, your presence will be a great addition to this ministry. We would love to continue reaching out to the community all year long just like we do for the week at VBS.

Everyone has different spiritual gifts, but the same Holy Spirit is at work in each one of you. If you are unsure how you might become involved here at St. John's, please reach out and let's talk so that we can find a place where you can find joy in serving. Volunteering not only makes a difference in the lives of the people that you serve, but it also makes a difference in your faith life as well. It is a great way to experience God's love at work **through** you toward others, but it is also a way that you can experience God's love **for** you in a powerful way.

What is a Christian? – Francis Chan

This is a great series to study on your own or as part of a small group. Chan does a great job of explaining how being a Christian is not just about what you believe but how the Holy Spirit transforms your life. If you want to be a small group leader in the Fall, you might watch this on your own over the summer so that you can see if you might like to watch it with your group!

2. Can I Trust the Bible? - Wesley Huff and Andy Steiger

Earlier this year, Wesley Huff made a name for himself by debating skeptic Billy Carson and then being featured on the Joe Rogan show to talk about Jesus, faith and the Bible. This is a short video series but it is packed with powerful information about why the Bible is truly a one-of-a-kind book that we can trust to lead us to the truth about Jesus.

3. Untangle Your Emotions – Jennie Allen

Mental Health is a huge issue in our society today and Jennie Allen helps us to connect our emotions and feelings to God's Word. She talks about how our feelings are meant to be **felt**—not **fixed**. That God **blessed** us with feelings and that they have a purpose. This six session series is meant to help you make sense of your emotions and see how God might help you see them as blessings again rather than problems.

I hope that you will take advantage of these videos and the over 25,000 other videos on all kinds of spiritual topics. They can really help you grow in your faith! – Pastor Broers

Excel in The Grace of Giving! "Why 'Give until it hurts'? Why not 'Give until it feels good' instead? After all, 2 Corinthians 9:7 says, 'God loves a cheerful giver!"

On average, 20% of congregation members give 80% of a church's annual budget. At St. John's, are you part of the 20% or the 80%? Imagine what the church could do if members shared the cost of ministry?

"Many of us feel so strapped for money that we can't imagine giving any more to the church. But you might not realize how much you are already spending on little things. For instance, if you visit Scooters three or four times a week, at \$7-8 a visit, you are spending \$1300 a year! How might you prioritize your money to be able to support the ministry of St. John's and make a bigger impact on your community?"

"Have you considered giving to St. John's electronically? It's convenient and guarantees that you stay up to date with your giving goals. Look at the yellow laminated card in your pew for information on how to use the 'Tithe.ly' giving app or scan the QR code to give a one-time or recurring donation."

May 2025 Treasurer's Report

- 1) Cash in Operating Checking Account decreased \$5,069 to \$6,143 in May. We have \$10,942 of unpaid benevolences and payroll tax liabilities as of 5/31/25.
- 2) We continue to be debt free.
- 3) May offerings of \$34,993 and year to date offerings total \$188,031 as compared to \$195,899 in 2024, \$203,275 in 2023, \$159,738 in 2022, and \$201,686 in 2021.
- 4) Operating expenses in April of \$45,640 were about \$250 over budget and for year to date we are about \$4,000 under budget.
- 5) Endowment funds now total \$625,847 after a net market investment gain of \$20,488 in May. The year-to-date investment market gain for 2025 is \$17,554.



From Orphanage to Expansive Outreach The Journey of Lutheran Services in Iowa

As we celebrate 160 years of ministry through Lutheran Services in Iowa, we are filled with gratitude, for the lives changed, the communities strengthened, and the faithful support that has sustained this work for generations.

What began as a small orphanage has grown into a statewide mission of compassion and care. The story of **Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI)** is one of transformation, deeply rooted in the Lutheran commitment to serve our neighbors in need.

1864: A Humble Beginning

LSI's story starts with the opening of the Lutheran Children's Home in 1864. In 1900, the home relocated to Waverly and was renamed the Bremwood Children's Home, becoming a place of refuge for countless children over the years.

1939–1945: Expanding the Mission

The mission widened in 1939 with the founding of the Lutheran Welfare Society of Iowa. By 1945, this ministry reached across the state, with offices in Council Bluffs, Des Moines, Iowa City, and Sioux City—bringing help and hope to more Iowans.

1963: A New Name, Broader Services

In 1963, the organization became Lutheran Social Services (LSS). Its ministries grew to include child welfare, foster care, and chaplaincy services—touching more lives and deepening its commitment to families.

2003: Uniting in Purpose

A major milestone came in 2003, when LSS merged with the Bremwood Children's Home, creating the organization we know today: Lutheran Services in Iowa (LSI). While Bremwood ceased functioning as a children's home, it became a residential treatment facility for youth serving faithfully until 2024.

2024: A Shift in Focus

Due to rising operational costs, LSI discontinued residential services in Waverly in 2024. However, the spirit of care lives on, LSI continues to provide a variety of services in the Waverly area and throughout Iowa.

A Mission That Grows with Grace

"We have evolved significantly from an orphanage that believed in being there for children who were in need to, now, a multi service Lutheran mission organization," says our President & CEO Renee Hardman.

Today, LSI serves Iowans through Early Childhood, Foster Care & Adoption, Global Greens, Mental Health, Services for People with Disabilities, Immigrant & Refugee Services.


