"My payer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in Me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as You are in Me and I am in You." – John 17:20-21

The verse above is a part of a much longer prayer that Jesus prayed for His disciples. But, in this passage,

Jesus shows that His heart was focused, not just on the disciples that He already had, but desired for the message of the gospel to be spread to more and more people over the course of time. In the gospel of Luke, chapter 19, we read a similar sentiment, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."

This year, I would like our focus at St. John's to reflect this aspect of God's heart: "to seek and save the lost." To reach out beyond our walls to the community of Le Mars and get the message of salvation through Jesus out to those who might be feeling **very** lost in this world right now. How might we invite people to be a part of God's kingdom and experience His joy, His peace and His presence in their lives? How might we serve them and show them that God's truly cares for them and their families? What are we doing as a church that might be creating obstacles to reaching new believers and what might we **start** doing that would help people commit to follow Jesus?

I would like all of you to first answer for yourself WHY you follow Jesus. If you can't answer this question, it's going to be really hard to share with anyone else why **they** should follow Jesus too. Is it the hope of eternal life that inspires you to follow Jesus? Then you will be most passionate about sharing that truth if someone asks you about your faith. Or, maybe it's the promise of unconditional love that Jesus gives that matters most to you. If you have come from a dark place in your past and experienced a new life through Jesus, that story might be a wonderful place to enter into conversations with others. On the other hand, perhaps it's the meaning and purpose being a follower of Jesus gives to your life that strengthens your faith. So many people today are searching for a purpose in their life and they might be just waiting to hear about what makes you excited to follow Jesus!

Once you know **WHY** you are a follower of Jesus, the next step is to have something to say. 1 Peter 3:15 says, "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." Write down your **WHY**. Write a sentence of two about why Jesus matters to you. Memorize it. I promise you that if you are prepared to share, God will provide the opportunities to use it!

Finally, pray. If you already have someone in mind who you wish was a Christian, or someone who seems to have lost their faith, ask God to provide you the perfect time and place to share your faith with them. Maybe it will be a simple invitation for them to come to church with you, or maybe you just share the church website and encourage them to watch a service on their own. You don't have to argue with them about some deep theological controversy. Just share what Jesus means to you and invite them to find out more. Remind them that coming to church is like "kicking the tires" on a new car . . . they don't have to commit to buying the whole car after one visit!

Throughout this year, I hope to give you lots of encouragement and practical ways to share your faith with others. As a church, I hope that we can look at our building and ministries with new eyes and ask ourselves what coming to a service for the first time at St. John's would be like if we had never stepped foot into a church before? What would be inviting and what would be scary? How might we best take someone from being a first-time visitor to a committed follower of Jesus? How can we best encourage a long-time attender to become a leader for others?

Jesus loves you and that care and compassion will never change. He has blessed us at St. John's so many times over! Now, I pray that we can take that blessed assurance of salvation and find new ways of sharing that good news with others. Amen.

# Treasurer's Report

# November 2025

1) Our Operating checking account decreased \$1,191 to \$16,730 in November. We have about \$9,600 of unpaid benevolences and payroll tax liabilities as of 11/30/25.



- 2) We continue to be debt free.
- 3) Offerings dropped in November to \$33,115 but this amount is similar to what we took in the previous two Novembers. Year to date offerings now total \$448,865 which compares favorably to last year's offerings of \$423,571, 2023 offerings of \$431,379, 2022 offerings of \$433,417, and 2021 offerings of \$437,132.
- 4) November operating expenses were \$36,758 as compared to a budget of \$42,190. We are now about \$35,000 under 2025 budgeted amount. Salary and benefits account for \$22,000 of this \$35,000 overall savings.
- 5) Endowment funds total \$670,000 after a November investment gain of \$5,985. Year-to-date investment gain now totals \$72,952.

# 1. The Book of 1st Corinthians Devotional – Jennie Allen

Christianity calls us to sacrifice instead of living for oneself. We have to choose one or the other—we can't do both. The Christians in Corinth tried to live the Christian life in a worldly way. Paul wrote the letter of 1 Corinthians to a divided and self-centered people to remind them to follow Jesus and only Jesus.

In this 12-week devotional, author and speaker Jennie Allen walks into the messy lives of the Corinthians and takes us through Paul's words to the conflicted church. We'll see how the truth of the gospel and the Spirit of God can empower us to choose to follow Jesus every day of our lives.

# 2. The Gospel of Mark Daily Devotional – Francis Chan

The Gospel of Mark chronicles Jesus's journey from Galilee to Jerusalem. Along the way, the Messiah gathers a ragged band of disciples. As crowds grow and dwindle on the road to Jerusalem, only a few stick by the Suffering Savior on the road of discipleship.

In this 11-week devotional on the Gospel of Mark, author and speaker Francis Chan invites us to walk with him along the ancient ways of the Master. Tracing the steps of Jesus and the Twelve through Israel, Francis explores the major themes of the Gospel of Mark, and asks: Are we willing to take this journey to embrace discipleship?

# 3. Your Bible - Zach Zehnder

Join Zach Zehnder for God Speaks, a 30-day journey through the Bible exploring how God's voice still teaches, rebukes, corrects, and trains us to live with purpose. Created in partnership with Lutheran Bible Translators, this series invites you to rediscover the life-changing power of God's Word.




