How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? And how can anyone preach unless they are sent? As it is written: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" – Romans 10:14-15

When we are babies, the whole world revolves around us. There is actually a term used to describe this coined by developmental psychologists: egocentrism. When we are very young, it's hard for us to distinguish between our wants, needs and perspectives and the understanding that the people around us may have different viewpoints on the world. Which is why, even though you've made it clear to everyone in the house that you are in a hurry to get to church, your youngest child might take that opportunity to start throwing a tantrum over not being able to bring a particular stuffed animal that just last week they had wanted to get rid of! The fact is that they aren't thinking about anyone else in that moment but themselves because, developmentally, they really don't have much capacity to do that.

As we get older, around 2 or 3, we start sensing that others have feelings about things. We might cry when they cry or laugh when they laugh, but we still don't think much about how **our** actions affect other people. Around 3-5 years old, we start recognizing that the people around us have feelings and beliefs that are different from our own. From 5-11, we get much better at understanding that not all people see things the same way. During adolescence, our empathy skyrockets and we might even start thinking a lot about what other people are thinking about us! In our late teens and early adulthood, we mature a great deal in this regard and we can start truly caring for other people and deliberately choosing **not** to act selfishly. We can care for other peoples' well-being and better balance their feelings, needs and desires with our own.

Part of our development as Christian men and women means that we need to start focusing on the needs of others rather than just our own feelings. Coming to church and being a part of a Christian community is about much more than our **personal** salvation. God calls us to think about how to spread this message of hope to the ends of the earth so that **all** people might come to faith in Jesus! And yet, it is very easy to make church all about ourselves. As I heard it put several years ago, for many people, church is thought to be like Burger King's old motto: "Have it **your** way." But if we are serious about sharing the gospel message with people who are not yet Christians, like Jesus wants us to, we really need to consider their perspectives, their backgrounds, their desires and their needs.

St. Paul was an expert on considering the perspectives of others in order share the truth of Jesus more effectively with them. He shares this attitude in 1st Corinthians 9:19-23, "Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone to win as many as possible. To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. . To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the

gospel, that I may share in its blessings." When sharing the gospel with others is your primary goal, you start developing a lot of empathy for what people are going through and how Jesus meets them where they are.

We already are doing this in lots of ways here at St. John's. Years ago, in order to modernize the worship service for younger families, the Contemporary worship service was started using drums, guitar, piano and song leaders to sing Praise songs. In order to help people remember the announcements and connect to the weekly sermon, we use the screen and pictures to get the message across. To help people more easily build community, we have been offering coffee and donut holes between services so that they might hang around and make new friends or reconnect with people they haven't seen in a while. We even started the GROW program on Wednesday nights so that we might have a way to reach out to the wider community who might not be in a habit of Sunday morning worship and Sunday school. And we are providing free food Wednesday evenings for busy families or for those struggling to make ends meet.

World Missions is another way that we seek to share the gospel with people around the globe. In order to spread the message of Jesus Christ with people from other cultures and languages, we have to think about what they need and how we might serve them. On Sunday, October 19th, we are going to be celebrating what I hope becomes an annual event: Missions Sunday! We have invited Pastor Mark Vander Tuig to give the message that day about the importance of Missions and we will be building awareness of local and worldwide Missions at several tables throughout the church. There will be a table for Compassion International Child Sponsorship, Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch, Her Health, Voice of the Martyrs, Lutheran World Relief and the Mission Trip St. John's will be going on next summer to Chicago. I hope that you take time that day to learn a little bit more about how you might impact the lives of others throughout our community and the world. Finally, there will be a potluck after the second service where we can reconnect with one another and continue to build a stronger community.

I look forward to seeing everyone at church on Sunday, October 19th, so that we can expand our perspective on how to love other people and follow God's call to go and tell everyone around the world about salvation through Jesus Christ. Amen.

"If you will live like, no one else, later you can live—and give—like no one else"- Dave Ramsey. When you make sacrifices now to get out of debt and build wealth, you will have the financial freedom to be incredibly generous later in life.

The Bible encourages us to share our time, talents **and** treasure. Some people want to donate money to church but don't want to be involved. God has bigger plans for you than that! Others argue that since they volunteer, they shouldn't have to give anything else. But that's the same problem. God wants us to learn to be generous in **all** aspects of our life; not just the ones we feel most comfortable with.

Consistency in giving is key. If you saw someone come to church once a month and drop in a hundred dollar bill each time for the offering, you would probably feel like they were a pretty generous giver. However, when you set up online giving for \$25 a week for the whole year, you will actually end up giving more! That's the power of consistency! Thank you for every gift you share with St. John's no matter how big or small!

Treasurer's Report

- 1) Our operating checking account increased \$7,585 to \$14,485 in August. We have \$10,212 in unpaid Benevolences as of 8/31/25 which will need to be paid by September month end.
- 2) We continue to be debt free.
- 3) Continued good news! Monthly offerings in August came in at \$49,656 after the July offerings of \$50,008. Excluding the month of December, this is our highest two-month total since the fall of 2022. Year-to-Date offerings now are at \$322,049 which compares to \$311,894 last year, 303,946 in 2023, \$255,907 in 2022, and \$328,527 in 2021.
- 4) August operating expenses of \$40,698 were about \$2,000 under budget and we are now about \$25,000 under our year-to-date 2025 budget.
- 5) Endowment funds total \$653,000 after an August investment gain of \$15,632. The overall gain in 2025 is now \$53,696.
- 6) Estate Gifts under investment (time certificates and savings accounts) total almost \$433,000. The interest earnings over the past 2 years total just over \$46,000.




