Discussion & Reflection Questions Greater Things - Week 5 - 20th of July 2025

Read: Luke 10:38-42

Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home. ³⁹ She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. ⁴⁰ But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.' ⁴¹ But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; ⁴² there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'

Questions

- 1. Do you have an immediate connection/affinity to either Mary or Martha?
- 2. Why do you think Martha was so upset with her sister?
- 3. In what ways might we relate to Martha's frustration when others don't seem to "pull their weight"?
- 4. How does this passage challenge the modern tendency to define identity by productivity or busyness?
- 5. How does Jesus' gentle response to Martha reflect his pastoral care rather than condemnation? Does it also reflect his affirmation that service is still important?
- 6. How might this passage encourage us to reframe "doing for Jesus" versus "being with Jesus"?
- 7. In what ways might your identity have become tied to what you do, rather than who you are in Christ?
- 8. How can your service or ministry become more fruitful when it flows from sitting first at the feet of Jesus?
