

## **Discussion and Reflection Questions**

### **Trinity Sunday - 31<sup>st</sup> of May 2026**

#### **Read: Matthew 28:16-20**

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <sup>17</sup>When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup>And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup>Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

#### **Questions**

1. The absence of Judas reminds us that the Christian journey includes loss & betrayal. Why is this important for both believers & non-believers?
2. What is the correlation between worship, doubt & faith?
3. What does it mean for Jesus to have all authority, & how should that shape the way we live & love as Christians?
4. What is the difference between making disciples and simply gaining converts or church attenders?
5. If we are to go into the world, how important is it for us to understand what is going on in the world? What do you think are the main issues that Christians should be aware of in the world at the moment?
6. How does Christ's presence encourage us in mission, especially when we feel inadequate or uncertain?
7. How does following the Great Commission help people discover the hope, purpose, and fullness of life that Jesus offers?
