WE ARE THE POLISH NATIONAL CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Solemnity of the Institution of the Polish National Catholic Church invites us to remember both sacrifice and faithfulness. The Polish National Catholic Church was formally organized in 1897 in Scranton, Pennsylvania, under the leadership of Franciszek Hodur. It arose out of a deep desire among Polish immigrants for pastoral care in their own language, transparency in parish governance, and respect for the dignity and contributions of the laity. When these concerns were not addressed within the structures of the Roman Catholic Church, tensions escalated. What began as a struggle for justice and representation ultimately led to separation, misunderstanding, and eventually excommunication. The early members of the PNCC endured rejection, legal battles over church properties, and painful division within families and communities.

Yet from persecution came perseverance. Our founders believed that fidelity to Christ required both courage and conscience. They held fast to Catholic faith and sacramental life while seeking reform rooted in the Gospel. Their suffering reminds us that the Church is not merely an institution, but a living body formed through sacrifice. As members of St. Jude the Apostle Polish National Catholic Church, we inherit not only a history of conflict, but a legacy of resilience, devotion, and trust in God's providence.

The same Spirit who sustained our founders continues to guide us today. On this solemnity, we are invited to give thanks for their faith and to examine our own. Do we value the sacrifices that secured our parish and our Church? And how are we called today to witness courageously to Christ, even when faithfulness requires perseverance?

Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.
