DO WE FOLLOW JESUS...THROUGH THE CROSS?

Palm Sunday invites us into a powerful paradox: we begin with joyful cries of “Hosanna!” as Jesus enters Jerusalem, yet we quickly move into the solemn reading of His Passion. In this moment, we are reminded how easily human hearts can shift—from praise to rejection, from faithfulness to fear. For us at St. Jude the Apostle Polish National Catholic Church, this day calls us not only to remember Christ’s suffering, but to examine our own discipleship. Do we follow Jesus only in moments of blessing, or are we willing to walk with Him through the cross? As we hold our palms, symbols of victory and peace, we are challenged to live lives that reflect Christ’s humility, obedience, and sacrificial love. Jesus does not enter Jerusalem with power or force, but in meekness and surrender to the Father’s will. This Holy Week, we are invited to walk closely with Him—to stand firm in faith, to embrace sacrifice, and to trust in the promise of resurrection that lies beyond the cross.

Reflection Questions:

1. In what ways do I welcome Jesus into my life, and where do I struggle to remain faithful to Him?
2. How can I more fully live out Christ’s humility and sacrificial love during this Holy Week?
3. bring life even in moments of suffering or loss?

Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.
