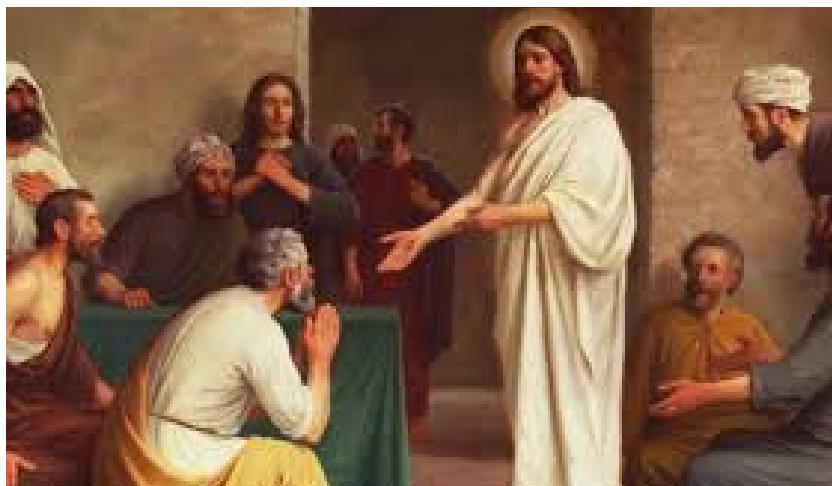

## WE ARE CALLED TO LIVE OUT MERCY

On this Second Sunday of Easter, we encounter the risen Christ entering into the fear and uncertainty of His disciples. Even though the doors were locked, Jesus comes and stands among them, offering peace: “Peace be with you.” In this moment, we see that no barrier—fear, doubt, or even sin—can keep Christ from reaching us. His presence is not dependent on our strength or readiness, but on His mercy and love. This is why this Sunday is also known as Divine Mercy Sunday: a reminder that the Risen Lord meets us not with judgment, but with compassion and healing.

Thomas, often remembered for his doubt, represents many of us. He longs for proof, for something tangible. Yet when Jesus invites him to touch His wounds, Thomas responds with a profound act of faith: “My Lord and my God!” Through Thomas, we learn that doubt is not the end of faith, but often a doorway into a deeper relationship with Christ. The wounds of Jesus, once signs of suffering, become signs of mercy—showing us that God transforms even our brokenness into grace.

As members of St. Jude the Apostle PNCC, we are called to live as witnesses of this mercy in our daily lives. Just as the disciples were sent forth, we too are sent to bring peace, forgiveness, and hope into a world still filled with fear and division. Christ breathes His Spirit upon us, empowering us to be instruments of His love. Let us open the doors of our hearts, allowing the Risen Christ to enter and transform us.

### Reflection Questions:

1. Where in my life do I need to allow Christ to enter and bring His peace?
2. How can I be a witness of God’s mercy and forgiveness to others this week?
