## COME FOLLOW ME, AND I WILL MAKE YOU FISHERS OF MEN

On this Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Gospel presents us with Jesus calling the first disciples by the Sea of Galilee: ordinary people, engaged in ordinary work, who are invited into an extraordinary mission. “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.” This call reminds us that vocation is not reserved for a few chosen saints or clergy alone; it begins in the midst of daily life. God calls fishermen, tax collectors, parents, workers, and elders—each with unique gifts—to participate in building the Kingdom. For us at St. Jude the Apostle Polish National Catholic Church, this passage invites reflection on how God may be calling each of us today, right where we are, to follow Christ more closely.

Vocation is always connected to mission. When the disciples leave their nets, they are not abandoning responsibility; they are embracing a deeper purpose. Likewise, our vocations—whether to ordained ministry, religious life, marriage, single life, or dedicated service—are ways God sends us into the world as witnesses of hope, justice, and compassion. Jesus begins His ministry by proclaiming repentance and the nearness of the Kingdom of God, showing us that mission starts with conversion of heart. Before we can share the Gospel, we must first allow it to shape our own lives.

As a parish community, we are called not only to listen for God’s call but also to foster and support vocations among us. This means praying for vocations, encouraging one another, and recognizing that every baptized person has a role in Christ’s mission. When we live our faith with joy, integrity, and generosity, we become living invitations for others to encounter Christ. May this Sunday renew in us a spirit of readiness—like the first disciples—to leave behind whatever holds us back and to follow Jesus wherever He leads, for the sake of the Gospel and the life of the world.

### Reflection Questions:

1. What “nets” might I be holding onto that keep me from responding more fully to God’s call in my life?
2. How can I more intentionally live out my vocation as a mission that serves Christ and builds up the Church and the world?
