WILL I CHOOSE TO LOVE?

The Feast of Brotherly Love in the Polish National Catholic Church is a day set aside to remember Christ's commandment to love one another as He has loved us. Rooted in Luke 10:25-37, the Parable of the Good Samaritan, this feast challenges us to break down barriers of division and extend compassion to those we encounter, even when it is inconvenient or uncomfortable. Just as the Samaritan crossed cultural and religious boundaries to help the wounded man, we too are called to step beyond our comfort zones, to love not only those who are close to us but also those whom society may overlook. This love is not simply a sentiment but a deliberate choice, a sacrifice, and an act of mercy that mirrors the very heart of Christ.

The history of the Feast of Brotherly Love is deeply tied to the identity of the PNCC. Established by Bishop Francis Hodur in the early 20th century, it emphasizes unity, forgiveness, and reconciliation within the Church and the world. It is often marked by the Holy Mass and the symbolic "Rite of Brotherly Love," where members exchange a sign of peace, underscoring that the Church is not just an institution, but a family bound by Christ's love. In celebrating this feast, we are reminded that our Catholic faith is lived most authentically when it is put into practice through acts of kindness, justice, and compassion. Brotherly love is not optional—it is the visible mark of being a disciple of Jesus.

Reflection Questions:

1. Who in my life right now is "lying by the roadside" in need of my compassion and mercy?
2. How can I allow the Feast of Brotherly Love to deepen my commitment to reconciliation, unity, and service in my parish community?
