CALLED TO BE HUMBLE SHEPHERDS

In celebrating the Solemnity of the Humble Shepherds, we are invited to look deeply at how God chooses those who are humble and open of heart to witness His greatest gift to the world—Jesus Christ. The shepherds in the Gospel narrative were simple, poor laborers in the fields, people easily overlooked by society, yet they were among the first to hear the angelic proclamation of Christ's birth and respond with faith and haste. Their humility drew them to Christ, and their encounter with the newborn Savior transformed them, compelling them to glorify and proclaim what they had experienced. In honoring these humble servants, the Church reminds us that God continues to call ordinary people to extraordinary discipleship.

This feast also offers a powerful contrast between good shepherds and bad shepherds—a theme woven throughout Scripture and reflected in Church teaching. A good shepherd, like Christ Himself, lays down his life for the sheep, placing the welfare of others above personal gain and guiding them with charity and self-sacrifice. In contrast, bad shepherds are those who look primarily after their own interests, neglecting the needs of the flock and failing to seek out the lost, the weak, and the suffering. The humble shepherds of Bethlehem model the self-giving disposition we are called to emulate: they heard God's word, acted without hesitation, and shared the joy of Christ's presence with others. In our times too, we are called to be good shepherds in our families, communities, and Church—serving with love, humility, and fidelity to the Gospel.

Reflection Questions:

1. In what ways am I being called to be a "humble shepherd" in my family, parish, or community this year?
2. How do I recognize and respond to situations where leadership or service can become self-serving rather than Christ-centered?
