ARE YOU READY FOR PASSION WEEK?

As we enter the Fifth Sunday of Lent, often called Passion Sunday, the Church invites us to stand at the threshold of the mystery of suffering and life. In this final stretch toward Holy Week, we are confronted with the reality of death—not only physical death, but the spiritual death that comes from sin, fear, and separation from God. Yet even here, Christ reveals that death does not have the final word. Just as He called Lazarus from the tomb, He calls each of us out of whatever binds us—our doubts, our wounds, and our burdens—into new life. For us as the faithful of St. Jude the Apostle Polish National Catholic Church, this is a time to trust deeply in the life-giving power of Christ. Passion Sunday reminds us that suffering is not meaningless when united with Him. Instead, it becomes a path to transformation. As we prepare to walk with Christ through His Passion, we are invited to remove the “stone” from our own hearts, allowing Him to bring healing, restoration, and hope. The question is not whether Christ has the power to raise us—but whether we are willing to hear His voice and step into the light.

Reflection Questions:

1. What “tomb” in my life is Christ calling me to come out of this Lent?
2. How can I trust more deeply in Christ’s power to bring life even in moments of suffering or loss?

Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.
