

WHAT IS SEPTUAGESIMA?

Septuagesima Sunday marks the beginning of a sacred threshold in the Church's life, drawing us gently away from the joy of Christmas and toward the discipline and conversion of Lent. Traditionally observed in the weeks preceding Ash Wednesday, Septuagesima invites the faithful to reflect on humanity's fallen condition and our deep need for God's grace. The Scriptures remind us that salvation is not earned by effort alone but is always a gift, freely given by God to those who respond in faith. This season teaches us humility, calling us to recognize both our weakness and God's unfailing mercy.

Spiritually, Septuagesima is a time to awaken our hearts. Like laborers in the vineyard, we are reminded that God's generosity is not measured by human standards. Whether we have walked faithfully with God for many years or are just beginning to return, the invitation to God's vineyard remains open. The Church urges us to examine our lives honestly—our habits, our priorities, and our openness to God's will—so that we may be better prepared to embrace the penitential journey ahead.

For the Polish National Catholic Church, Septuagesima Sunday also echoes our rich heritage of faithful perseverance. It invites us to renew our commitment to prayer, sacramental life, and service to one another. As we stand at the doorway of Lent, we are encouraged not to delay conversion but to respond generously to God's call today. In doing so, we grow in spiritual maturity, trusting that God's grace is sufficient to transform our hearts and lead us toward the fullness of life in Christ.

Reflection Questions

1. As Septuagesima Sunday begins our preparation for Lent, what areas of my life is God inviting me to examine more honestly and place more fully in His care?
2. How do I respond to God's generosity—do I compare my journey of faith to others, or do I trust that God's grace is given freely and lovingly to me where I am today?

Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.
