WE ARE THE POLISH NATIONAL CATHOLIC CHURCH

The Fourth Sunday of Lent, often called Laetare Sunday, gives us a moment of hope and joy in the middle of our Lenten journey. In this Sunday's Gospel (John 9:1-41), Jesus heals the man born blind. More than a physical healing, this miracle reveals a deeper truth: Christ brings light not only to our eyes but also to our hearts. The man who once lived in darkness comes to recognize Jesus, while those who believed they could see clearly—the religious leaders—remain spiritually blind. This reminds us that faith is not simply about knowledge or status; it is about openness to the light of Christ.

For us at St. Jude the Apostle Polish National Catholic Church, this Gospel invites reflection on how Christ continues to open our eyes today. During Lent we examine our lives, our choices, and our relationship with God. Sometimes we may not even realize the areas where we are spiritually "blind"—habits, pride, or fears that keep us from seeing God's work around us. Yet Jesus meets us where we are, offering healing, clarity, and the light of truth. As we move closer to Easter, we are reminded that Christ's light is always stronger than any darkness we face. Laetare Sunday encourages us to rejoice because God's grace is already at work within us. Even in the midst of repentance and sacrifice, Lent is not meant to be a season of despair but of transformation. Just as the blind man came to see both physically and spiritually, we too are invited to step into the light of Christ and live as witnesses to His truth and mercy in our families, our parish, and our community.

Reflection Questions:

1. In what areas of my life might I be spiritually "blind," and how is Christ inviting me to see more clearly?
2. How can I reflect the light of Christ to others during this Lenten season? ✨

Our Lenten regulations are recommended for healthy adults. Children under First Holy Communion age, the infirm, those on restrictive medication and the elderly are exempt from the obligation of fasting.
