STORE UP TREASURES?

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who built bigger barns to store all his grain and goods, only to lose his life that very night. At first glance, we might think Jesus is saying that it is wrong to work hard and provide for our families. But that is not the point. The message is much deeper: our lives are not defined by what we own, but by how we live in relationship with God and others. Wealth, possessions, and even success are temporary—they cannot save us, nor do they go with us when we leave this world.

For many of us, family is central. We work hard to put food on the table, to provide for our children, and to give them opportunities we did not have. This is good and noble. But Jesus challenges us: are we working only to accumulate and secure our own comfort, or are we also rich in love, generosity, and service to others? Think of abuelita who always cooked an extra plate for a neighbor in need, or the parishioner who donates not just money, but time and energy to the Church. These are treasures stored in heaven, treasures no one can take away.

This Gospel calls us to examine our hearts. Do we place our security in what we have, or in God who provides? Do we trust that sharing what we have will not leave us empty, but actually draw us closer to the Kingdom of Heaven?

Questions for Reflection:

1. In my daily life, am I more concerned with building "bigger barns" for myself, or with sharing God's blessings with others?
2. What steps can I take this week to become "rich toward God" in generosity, compassion, and love? Would you like me to also create a short Spanish-language summary of this reflection so it resonates even more with Hispanic parishioners?
