O GOD BE MERICIFUL TO ME, A SINNER.

The Gospel for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Luke 18:9-14) reminds us of the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. Jesus contrasts two distinctly different approaches to prayer: one characterized by pride, and the other by humility. The Pharisee boasts of his good deeds, comparing himself to others, while the tax collector simply says, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." In these few words, Jesus teaches that true holiness is not found in appearances or status, but in a heart that recognizes its need for God's mercy.

For us, as faithful members of the Polish National Catholic Church, this message calls us to balance our heritage of faith with a humble and sincere spirit. We may feel the tension between tradition and modern life, between what we've received from our parents and what we are called to live out today. But the Gospel reminds us that what matters most is not how we compare to others or how perfect we appear, but how open we are before God—honest, real, and aware of our dependence on His grace. In a world that rewards pride and self-promotion, the way of humility is the way of Christ.

When we come before God in prayer, especially at Mass, we are invited to come as the tax collector did—with a contrite heart, trusting that God's mercy transforms us. This humility builds stronger families, deeper communities, and a more compassionate Church. It reminds us that mercy, not judgment, is the foundation of our relationship with God and one another.

Reflection Questions:

- I. In what ways do I sometimes act like the Pharisee—comparing myself to others instead of focusing on my relationship with God?
- 2. How can I grow in humility and gratitude in my prayer life this week?
