#### **Meet the Boshovens:**

Pastor Richard (Rick) and Christine (Chris) Boshoven are both Michigan natives, who met during their college days at Central Michigan University.

Chris grew up in Sydney, Michigan and Rick grew up in Grand Rapids, and Cadillac. They were married in 1984 and made their first home in Holland, MI, where they both became active at Zion Lutheran Church. As a member there, Rick was encouraged to enter the ministry. The family moved to St. Louis where he attended Concordia Seminary, graduating in 2000. His first call was to a small congregation in Hebron, Indiana, followed by a call in 2010 to Trinity Memorial in Merrillville, Indiana. During his time there, he received his Intentional Interim Ministry certification (referred hereafter as Transitional Interim Ministry/TIM).

In 2022, they returned home to Michigan to be closer to Chris' parents. They now live in Alma Michigan and Pastor Boshoven began a TIM service call with two congregations located in Lowell and Ionia. They allowed Pastor Boshoven an extra year of IIM/TIM service in order that he might locate a willing Hub congregation in the Grand Rapids Circuit. As his current call as an IIM/TIM for those congregations is coming to an end, Rev. Boshoven is now available to serve another IIM/TIM call.

Rick and Chris have two adult sons, Aric and Ben, who reside in Valparaiso, Indiana. Chris earned her undergraduate degree from Michigan State University and her Master's in Communications from Valparaiso University. Currently, she enjoys freelance writing for the Gratiot County Herald and working for Alma College. The Boshovens enjoy camping, theater, and working on their home & garden. Additionally, I can share that Rick enjoys a variety of activities, including some artistic creativity in woodworking, painting, wood sculpting and various other things that caught his interest.

Rick is naturally very personable, commands a joyful mannerism, and seems very insightful in many areas.

#### **NEW: Faith at Home Milestones**

This year, we will be starting a new program at St. Paul called Faith at Home Milestones. This program is designed to walk alongside parents in raising their kids. The program has milestone classes for parents corresponding to every year of their child's life. As your children age, they will be asked to join you for milestones classes to have deep conversations about real-life issues. Please keep an eye out and sign up for the milestones that correspond to your children.

#### FAQ:

#### 1. What is a Faith at Home Milestone?

- Faith at Home Milestones are opportunities for your family to engage in your faith together.
- Each Milestone will include <u>education for parents</u>, <u>encouragement for your home</u> faith life, and a gift for your child.
- Some milestones involve your child as well to help them engage their faith more deeply.

#### 2. What do I have to do in a milestone class?

- Participate in <u>all</u> the education times (a <u>total of 3 hours per milestone</u>).
- Be open to trying something new in your home

#### 3. Why these age ranges?

- There are Milestones for <u>birth 12<sup>th</sup> grade</u>, but they are spread out for your convenience.
- The age ranges listed for each class are a guideline, not a rule. You, as the parent, should take advantage of as many as possible as you disciple your children.
- The Milestones program has 18 total milestones. Some repeat every year; some are every other year.

#### 4. What if I miss the class time?

• Talk with Zane about the classes you will miss. We may be able to meet with you at a different time to finish that milestone with you.

#### 5. Why should I participate in any of these?

- Each milestone is designed to address key areas of faith formation for your family.
- Parents (or guardians) are the primary teachers of the faith to their kids.
- The completion of each milestone is rewarded with a gift designed to help your family grow in the faith.
- Each milestone will include <u>important conversations</u> to have at home and some tips and tricks to talk about difficult topics.

When the ingathering begins, kindly bring your filler items to church, where we will have a "Box of the Week" under the table under the second coat rack in the hall.

We are transitioning from using shoeboxes to the "Go Boxes" provided by Samaritan's Purse. The Gospel Opportunity, or "Go Boxes" are easier to fill and pack into cartons. As a result, we no longer need shoeboxes and we thank all who have donated them over the years by bringing them to church or to our house. We also give a huge thank you to Marilyn Hinderer and Cheryl Voss for faithfully wrapping our shoeboxes in bright colored Christmas wrapping paper for many years. That was a beautiful way to bring the joy of Jesus to the children who received the wrapped shoeboxes. Thank you, Marilyn and Cheryl!

We will have an ingathering at church beginning in late September for shoebox filler items. We have included the ingathering schedule for this year on a separate page in this newsletter.

Those who sow in tears shall reap with shouts of joy!
He who goes out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, bringing his sheaves with him.

**September 14** - Today, we celebrate the festival of the exaltation of the **Holy Cross**.

This day originally commemorated what was considered the discovery of the original cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. In the early fourth century AD, St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, discovered the cross. She thought it was authenticated when it effected a miraculous healing. The Church of the the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem was then constructed on the site where it was found. This building was dedicated on September 13, 335, but the Holy Cross was exposed for public veneration for the first time on the next day, September14, hence the present festival.

Martin Luther was no great lover of the feasts dedicated to the holy cross. He saw in them the danger of superstition akin to the relic trafficking he had so long opposed. He once quipped that if all the alleged pieces of the "true cross" were gathered together, it would constitute a pretty massive object! Rather than fixating on the relics, he directed attention to the crucified and risen Christ.

Still, many Lutheran Church orders intentionally chose to retain the festival, and "Holy Cross" continues to be a popular name for Lutheran congregations to this day. What Lutherans celebrate on Holy Cross Day, however, is not primarily the history of a rediscovered relic

attested by miracles. Rather, we celebrate the triumph of our Lord upon the indisputably real cross that once stood on Golgotha. There in love the Father's eternal Son and the Son of the blessed Virgin Mary poured out His life. His blood blotted out the sin of the world. His death proved death's destruction, as His divine life and love were finally and gloriously indigestible. We celebrate on this festival the way God used and uses suffering to bring blessing; the way He worked and works so contrary to anything human reason could or would ever conceive or anticipate.

Lutherans, of course, do not deny the possibility that the original cross was the one discovered by St. Helena. Yet, to us, whether that relic is authentic is not of prime importance. What does matter is that many years ago, under Pontius Pilate, our Lord Jesus was nailed to a tree through His hands and His feet. He was lifted up just as He foretold He would be. And through this unfathomable act of divine love, He still draws all people to Himself through the redemption that is in His blood, the forgiveness of our sins according to the riches of His grace. Better than any relic is the living body and blood which He imparts to us in the Eucharist as the lasting memorial of the holy cross.
