Beginning Our Journey Together

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It's been two months since I arrived in Caro to serve as your Transitional Interim Pastor, and already I've seen glimpses of the Spirit's movement among us—through your hospitality, your stories, and your deep love for this congregation. I'm grateful to be walking with you in this season of discernment and hope.

Before we form a call committee, we need to lay our foundation on the work of transition. This isn't merely an administrative task—it's also our spiritual work. It's about listening to one another and opening ourselves to the future that the Lord our God desires for us. In order to guide this process, we'll be launching a series of (4) **Fellowship Forums**: congregational gatherings designed to help us reflect, share, and seek clarity together.

These forums will help us answer four essential questions:

- 1. Who are we? Who have we been, who are we now, and who do we want to be in the future? What is our identity as a congregation? What stories shape us?
- 2. **What do we do?** What ministries, missions, and programs define our life together?
- 3. **How do we do it?** What are our patterns, processes, and ways of working?
- 4. Where do we do it? What is our context—our community, our culture, our place?

These questions are not merely theoretical. They're the scaffolding for our discernment. The answers we uncover will help us understand what kind of pastor you need—not just to maintain what is, but to lead us boldly into what could be.

This is holy work. It requires honesty, curiosity, and grace. It will take time, and it will ask something of each of us. But I believe it will also bring healing, clarity, and renewed purpose.

So, watch for these opportunities. I invite you to attend these forums. Bring your voice, your memories, your hopes. Let's listen deeply to one another and to the Spirit who is already preparing our way.

November 30 - Today, the Holy Church rejoices in the Festival of **St. Andrew, Apostle.**



Andrew was among the first of our Lord's disciples. He was the son of Jonah and brother of Simon, whom Jesus renamed Peter. The family was from Bethsaida in Galilee. With his brother, Andrew was a fisherman by trade.

In the Gospel of John, we find Andrew introducing others to the Lord Jesus. Andrew had apparently been a follower of St. John the Baptist. Upon hearing John point to Jesus as "the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world," Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus and spent the day with Him. Later, Andrew "first found his brother Simon and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' (which means Christ). He brought him to Jesus" (John 1:41-42). Thus, Andrew is regarded as the first "home missionary," recognizing the importance of telling those closest to him about the Lord and introducing them to Him.

Some time later in Galilee, Jesus would specifically summon Peter, Andrew, James, and John from their vocation as fishermen to follow Him (see

Mark 1:16). He would make them become fishers of men.

In John 12, some Greeks who had come to Jerusalem for the Passover desired to see Jesus. They first approached Philip (also a native of Bethsaida), and Philip turned to Andrew for assistance. Andrew and Philip brought word to Jesus, who exulted that as He is lifted up from the earth, He will draw all people to Himself. Thus, Andrew may also be regarded as the first "foreign missionary," recognizing the need for introducing those who come from distant lands to Jesus.

Andrew witnessed his Lord's resurrection, being with the others in the Upper Room on Easter evening and the week following. After Pentecost and the dispersion of the apostles, Andrew is said to have preached his Master's resurrection as far as Scythia or Thrace. According to tradition, he was martyred by crucifixion in Patras in Achaea.

Because Andrew felt unworthy to die upon the same kind of cross as his Lord had, he begged to be crucified on an X-shaped cross. This was granted him. Hence his symbol in church art is a cross in that particular shape. After his death, his bones were at one time interred in Constantinople and later transferred to the cathedral of Amalfi in Italy.

St. Andrew's Day always determines the beginning of Advent, for the first Sunday in Advent falls on the Sunday nearest to his festival.


