Take a look at a book...

I'm excited to start a new feature in our newsletter! When space allows, I'll be highlighting a book from the library's collection. To kick things off, I walked in and grabbed a random book from the shelf: "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23" by Phillip Keller.

While I haven't read it yet myself, it looks like a fascinating read. Here's a glimpse of what it offers:

In "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23," author Phillip Keller draws upon his personal experience as a shepherd to provide a unique and intimate perspective on this beloved biblical passage. He meticulously examines each verse, offering rich insights into the relationship between a shepherd and his sheep as a metaphor for the relationship between God and His people.

Keller explains the literal, day-to-day realities of shepherding, from providing nourishment and protection to guiding the flock through dangerous terrain. He then beautifully parallels these duties with the spiritual care and guidance that God offers. For instance, he describes how a shepherd leads his sheep to "green pastures" and "still waters," not just for physical sustenance, but for rest and restoration. This, Keller illustrates, is akin to how God provides for our spiritual needs and offers peace to our souls.

Through his shepherd's lens, Keller unpacks the deeper meanings behind phrases like "He restores my soul" and "Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me." The rod, he explains, is a tool for protection against predators, while the staff is used for gentle guidance. This imagery vividly portrays God as both a powerful protector and a tender guide.

Ultimately, the book paints a powerful picture of God's loving, constant, and personal care. By grounding the psalm in the tangible realities of a shepherd's life, Keller makes the profound truths of God's provision and comfort accessible and deeply moving.

Doesn't that sound like a wonderful perspective? I hope you'll check it out from the library and let me know what you think!

TRUNKS WANTED


Come out and support this community event! What to do:
